God allowed us to create together.

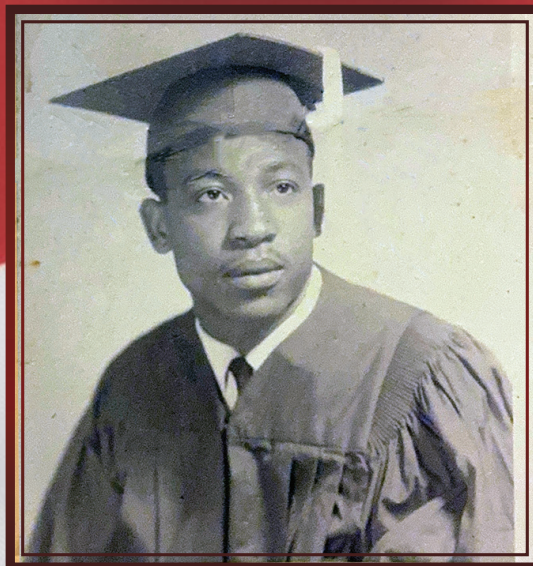
Thank you for every moment,

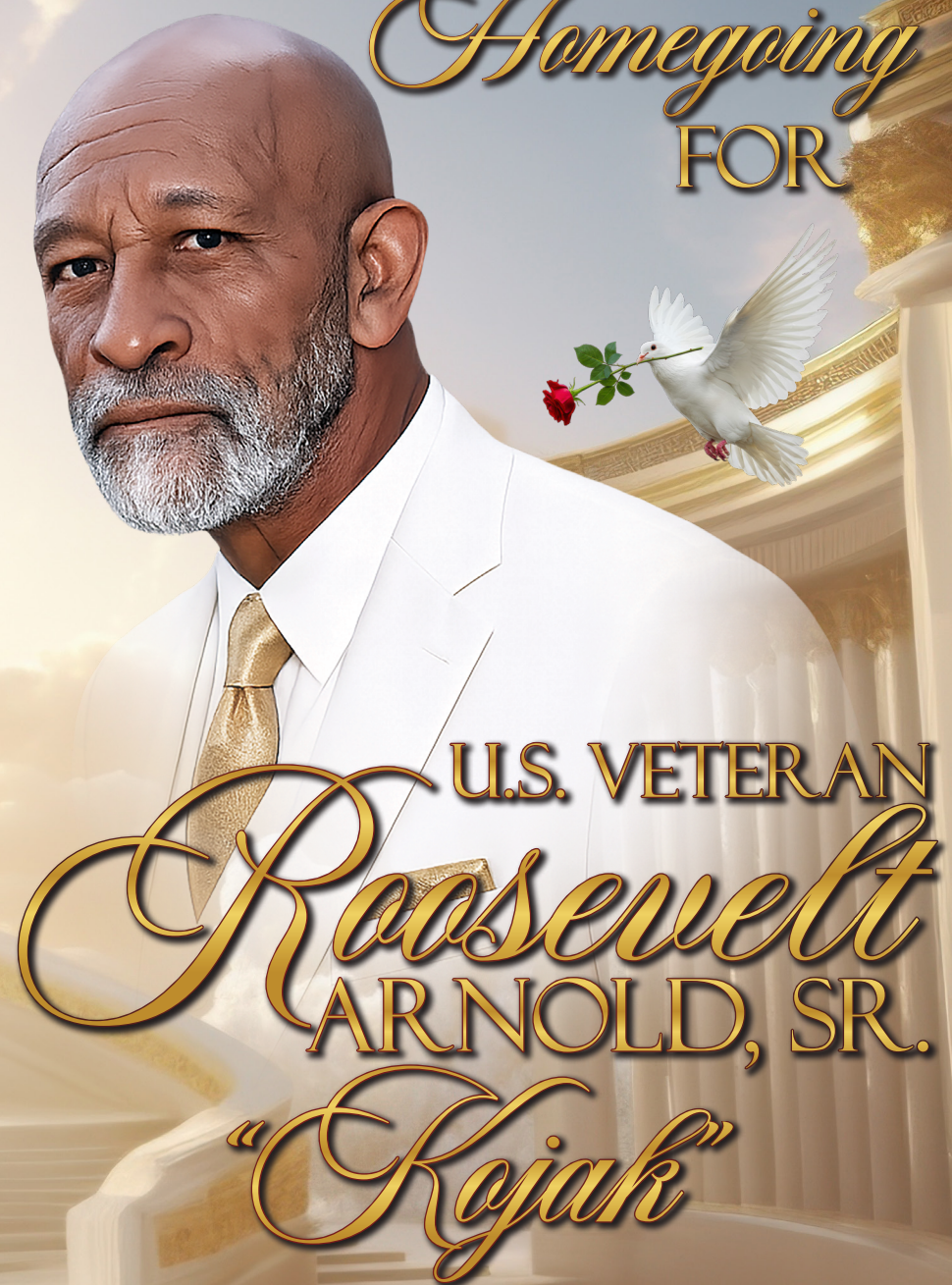
