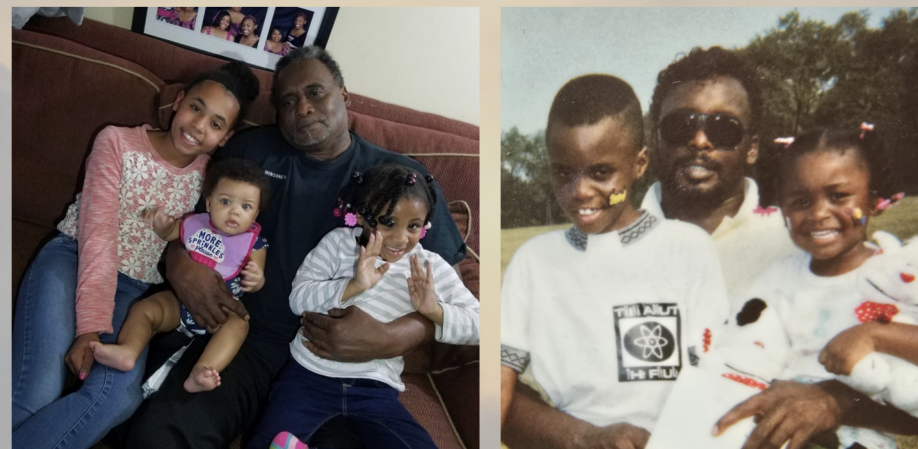
He is preceded in death by his father, brothers Philip and Larry Marable and grandson DeVante Marable
