I won't be far away, for life goes on

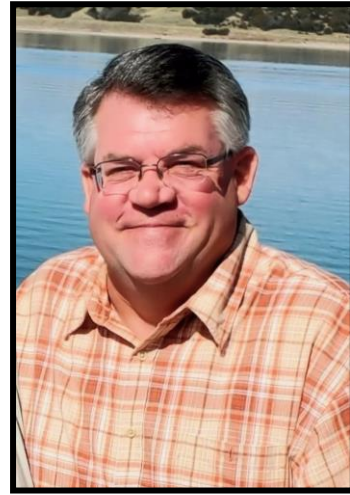
So if you need me, call and I will come.
