Life Reflections

Missionary Eulalee Hinds is the 2nd of 12 Children born to the Late Missionary Eva Dawkins-Lewis. She attended the Porus Primary and Secondary School.

She was baptized at the Blue Mountain Shiloh Apostolic Church in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ at a very tender age and never wavered in her faith. In 1970 at the tender age of 17, she went to live in Goshen with her aunt, the Late Pastor Willell Charlton, where she spent over 15 years. There she attended the Goshen Shiloh Apostolic Church and served years as a Youth President. Realizing her love for children, she went into early childhood education. Eulalee then started teaching in 1976 at The Goshen Basic School and did so for over 15 years. An Ardent Church member and devoted child of God, she was extremely loved by her church family. She was involved in all affairs of the church's many ministries: women auxiliary, women's department, young people's department, Sunday school department and tuck shop just to name a few. She is of a quiet demeanor to those that are not her immediate family. But surely, once you get to know her she can be a lengthy talker. She loved to reminisce about the past and kept current with happenings in and around the community.

On May 29, 1990 Eulalee migrated to the USA where she joined her childhood friend the late Ivy Davy-Christian. She then became a member in the Brooklyn Shiloh Apostolic Church, where she continued the work for the Lord. Yearly at the national Convention of the Shiloh Apostolic Church she owned the Tuckshop and mentored Peter Charlton (junior) who was her assistant. She continued to work relentlessly in the house of the Lord as national Treasurer of the Youth department. She blazed the trail as the first President of the international Youth Department in the USA. She exuded dedication, class and love for God as she also worked endlessly in BSAC Women's Department, serving as President for over 15 years after which she passed the baton to yours truly, Sherine Bogle.

Eulalee had a passion for the pastry industry and pursued an associates degree in Pastries. She loved to bake so much. She would bake for her Church Families, coworkers, friends and of course her biological families. She was always giving away pastries. If she'd sold them she would have made a lot of money! She had such a passion for giving that she implemented a share day at Brooklyn Shiloh Apostolic church and the community members came and benefited. She also managed to reach out Internationally, using her younger sister Angela as the Santa Claus without a sleigh delivering packages in the community. She was instrumental in her sister Eulalee's cause and carried out her wishes, touching the lives of many people.

Eulalee resumed work in child care and was blessed to work with Ms S Brenie, Mr D Hertzberg and Ms Debbie who then permanently added her as a part of her family for over 30 years until she passed. She never lost touch.

Lastly, she was a member of the Brooklyn Shiloh Apostolic "Prayer Band Ministry", where they visited with the elderly shut-ins, sick persons, praying and fasting, seeking God for just about anyone who wanted this group in their homes or remotely in the Sanctuary.

After a number of years with child care, Eulalee moved up to adult care and she obtained a career as a nursing assistant and while in search of a job in that field she met Ms Mae Stewart, a friend whom she had not seen for a number of years. Mae then encouraged her to work at the facility in which she was currently employed. Eulalee did just that and worked at Inglemoor Rehabilitation Center from Sept 22, 2010 until she became ill in 2020.

In May 2020 she caught Covid 19. After treatment she complained of stomach pain. After a number of tests she was confirmed to have Pancreatic Cancer. Although diagnosed with such a catastrophic illness, her faith remained unshaken. Her unwavering trust in God was an inspiration to anyone who witnessed it and a testament to how much she was dedicated to the will of God. She often said "I will not question God, let his will be done". When asked, even in the moments of extreme discomfort, how she was doing she would reply "mi aright enuh! Not too bad you know, God is good. Yes mon God is good"

(Psalm 71) In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust : let me never be put to confusion. This psalm was a revelation she personally received from the Lord which she shared with many. The word served as a consolation for her, this caused her end of life caretakers Petergaye (Niece), Oniel (Nephew) and Samantha (Niece), to read to her daily, singing and playing worship songs to soothe her. Deacon Stephen Bogle (Brother) and Pastor Paul Charlton (Cousin) played integral role in her care.

On Sunday August 8, 2021, the Prayer Band members along with her family made sure they reached her home before her awaiting her discharge from the hospital.

As EMTs entered her home the group was singing "Welcome Welcome Welcome Blessed Holy Ghost we welcome you. She gave her usual infectious smile and got out of the chair singing and clapping her hands. The EMT seemed surprised, but waited patiently until she was finished with her spiritual burst of energy. That was an uplifting moment that no one would have dared to interrupt. After which she politely thanked the EMT for taking her home. She then thanked everyone that attended and told the believers she was happy to see them.

On Friday August 13, 2021 Missionary Eulalee Hinds without confusion and in a peaceful manner answered her heavenly fathers call. As known, (7) seven is God's perfect number. God ordained (7) seven family members around her bed. Songs were sung, scripture was read as they watched her transition and took her last breath as Psalm 23, The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want was repeated.

To celebrate her life, she leaves behind siblings: Ionie, Lorna, Eliza, Stephen, Joan, Joycelyn, Sandra, Angela, Rosemarie, and a host of other relatives, friends and church family. She also leaves behind an indelible mark on this world. She is a true example of dedication, sacrifice, passion, class and love. She will be thoroughly missed.

Now her spirit is free. The holy hills of heaven called her to mansions bright across the seas. Goodbye to her pain and sorrows, So long Bye Bye. So Long Bye Bye. church so long bye bye. She is now waiting for a glorified body where she will say, "Death where is thy sting" or "grave where is thy victory". No grave! cannot hold her body down when the trumpet of the Lord shall sound Missy Eulalee Hinds glorified body will be untouchable. No Covid 19, No Cancer, or any other diseased hereafter shall overtake her glorified body. There is going to be a meeting in the air. Sleep on Eulalee and take your rest. We will meet in glory someday!!
