On Thursday, May 22, 2025, Audrey W. Moore was gently called home to eternal rest. Surrounded by her family's love and God's grace, she left this world just as she lived in it, with dignity, compassion, and a heart full of love.

Born May 12, 1938, in Charleston, South Carolina, Audrey was the cherished daughter of the late Horace M. Weaver and the late Martha G. Weaver. As the seventh of eight children, she grew up in a home where faith, family, and fortitude were deeply rooted. Audrey received her early education in Berkeley County, SC, and California, later graduating from Berkeley Training High School. With a love for learning and a desire to grow, she pursued continuing education at Allen University in Columbia, South Carolina.

Audrey's journey took her to New York, where she worked for the State of New York, building a life marked by perseverance and purpose. Here she met the love of her life and husband, Milton Moore. Upon returning to her beloved Charleston, she continued her service to others through meaningful roles with the South Carolina Department of Social Services and the Division of Child Care Licensing.

An amazingly gifted prayer warrior, counselor, and nurturer, Mrs. Moore was regularly called upon for counsel and guidance.

She was also a proud and lifelong member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., and the Order of the Eastern Star, through which she furthered her dedication to service, sisterhood, and excellence. Audrey continued her work in social services by being an active member of the SC Chapter of AARP #247 and enjoyed fun times with other seniors through Roper Advantage programs. Audrey possessed a divine gift for making people feel seen, heard, and loved. Her home was a place of peace and warmth as well as a refuge for family, friends, and anyone in need. She opened her doors and her heart to many, welcoming them not only with open arms but with a plate of food, a word of wisdom, and a spirit that healed. Her cakes were symbols of celebration and care, passed around family tables and gatherings with joy. As a masterful seamstress and talented event planner, Audrey had a unique ability to transform ordinary moments into sacred ones.

Above all, Audrey was the heart of her family—a guiding light, a gentle strength, and a constant source of love. She leaves behind a rich legacy and memories that will be cherished for generations.
