Mary Dawson Morman, 81 a loving wife, mother, sister, auntie and friend, entered into eternal life on Thursday February 26, 2026, at Emory Hospital Hospice in Atlanta, Georgia.

Mary was born July 17, 1944, in Camilla, Georgia, to the late Mr. John L Dawson and Mrs. Eula B. Dawson. She was the third of four siblings. She joined Brown Chapel Christian Methodist Episcopal (CME) Church at a young age and served the Lord faithfully wherever she lived. Mary graduated from Camilla Consolidated High School in 1962 and attended Albany State College.

Mary married her high school boyfriend, Frank Morman Jr, of Baconton, Georgia in September 1963 and became an Air Force wife. Together they toured the world.
