Karolyne is the product of the Peach County school system graduating from Henry A. Hunt High in 1969. She received a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology from Fort Valley State University in 1973. She was married to Melvin Fleming welcoming two beautiful children: Adrian D. Fleming and Malissa C. Fleming Jackson.

Karolyne lived and thrived in Miami, Florida where she served as a Social Worker for the Department of Children and Family Services, later becoming a Juvenile Justice Probation Officer. It was during this time that Karolyne touched numerous lives in her 36 Years of selfless service and dedication, impacting thousands of at-risk and vulnerable inner-city youths. During her time in Miami, Florida, Karolyne also served diligently as a member of Peaceful Zion Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Dr. C.P.
