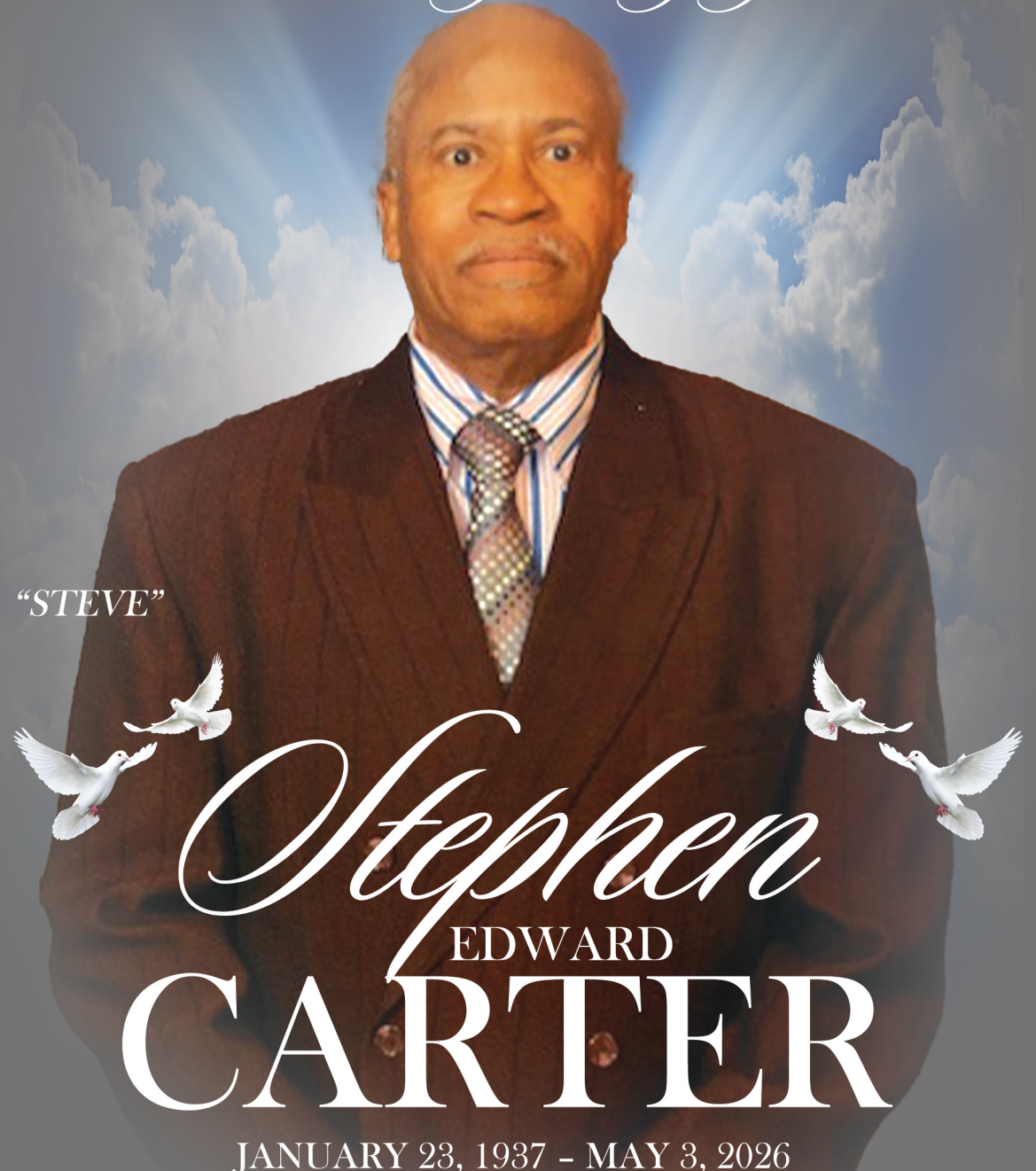

Stephen Edward Carter was born on January 23, 1937, in Demopolis, Alabama, to the late Eddie L. Carter and Gertrude Willis Carter. He departed this life on May 3, 2026, in Denver, Colorado. During his earthly journey, God blessed Steve with a long life, resilience, and the ability to wear many "hats."

Steve as he was fondly called by family and friends, received his education in the Demopolis public schools and graduated from U.S. Jones High School in 1954. He was known for his artistic ability, outgoing personality, and love of sports.

At an early age, Steve accepted Christ and joined Saint Paul Baptist Church in Demopolis, where Reverend C. C. Ellis was pastor. 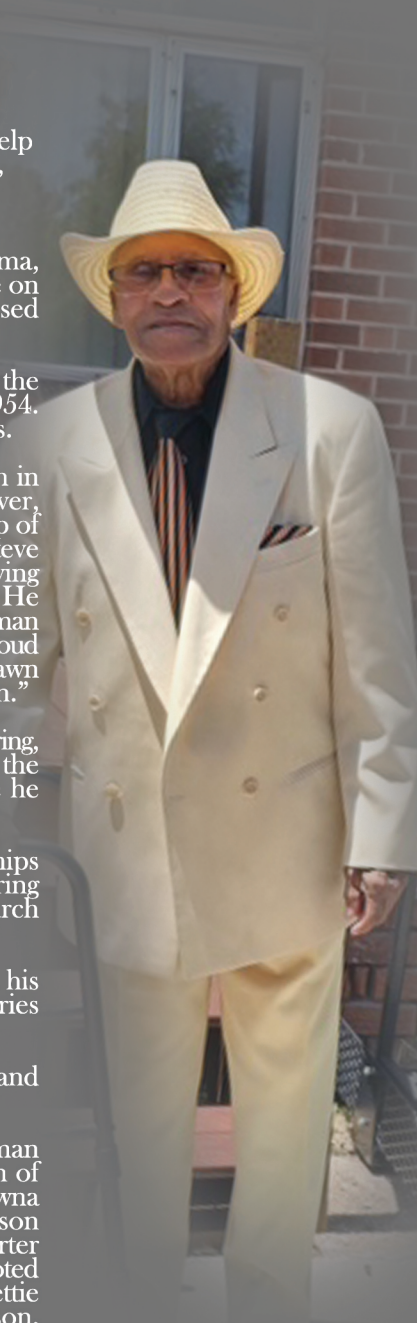
