and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.*





An avid sports enthusiast, Jim cheered passionately for the Oklahoma State Cowboys and the Dallas Cowboys. His love of the game also inspired him to coach little league football, basketball, and cheer teams for many years, encouraging and mentoring young athletes with enthusiasm and care. When he wasn't at the ball field, Jim often found peace on the water, fishing and enjoying the quiet moments of life.

Jim was preceded in death by his parents, Cyril and Mary Ann; his brother, David Blouch; his sister, Janice Morgan; his mother- and father-in-law, Rufus F. and Myrtle A. Melton; several brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law; countless beloved pets; and dear friends who went before him.
