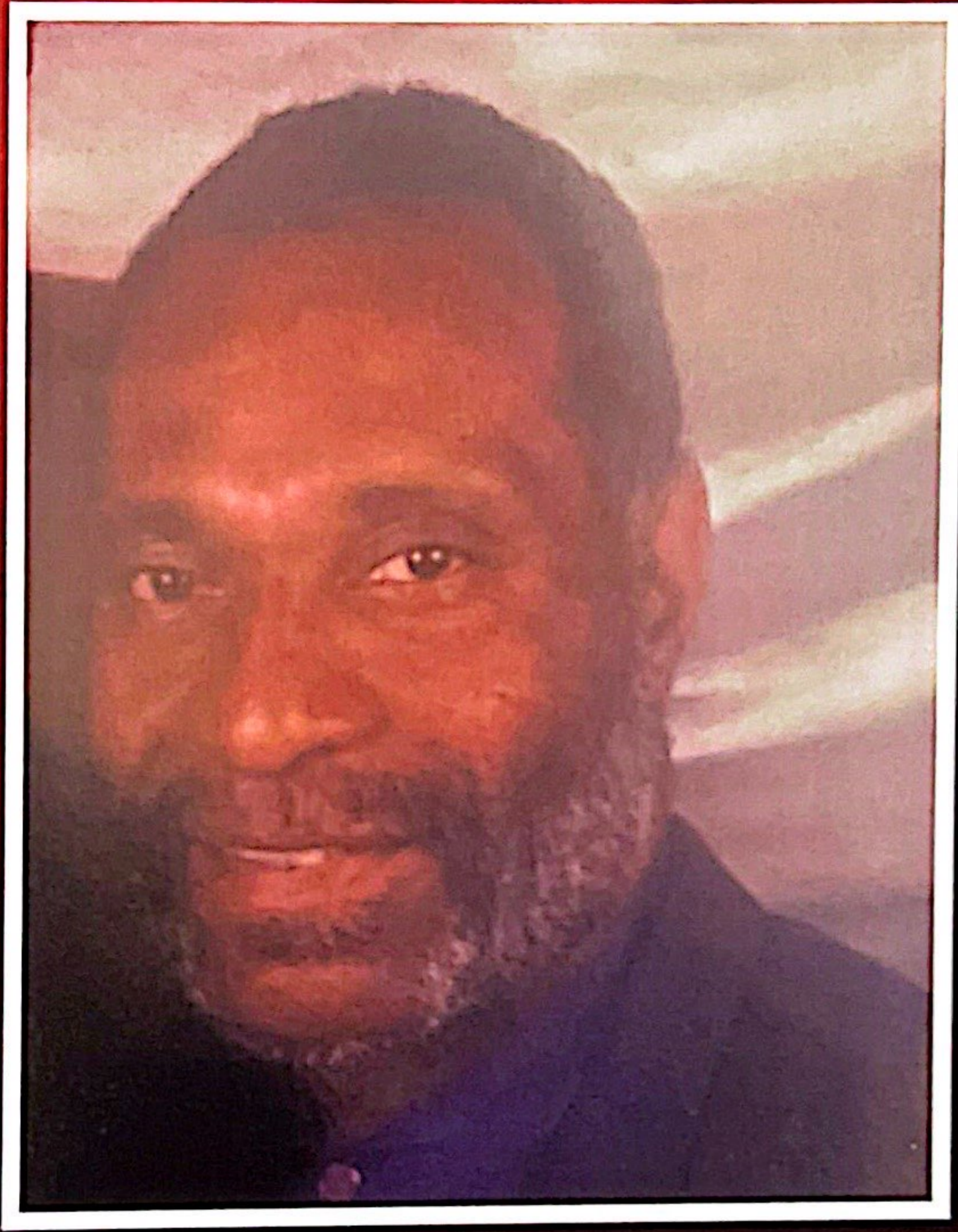

# A Life Well Lived



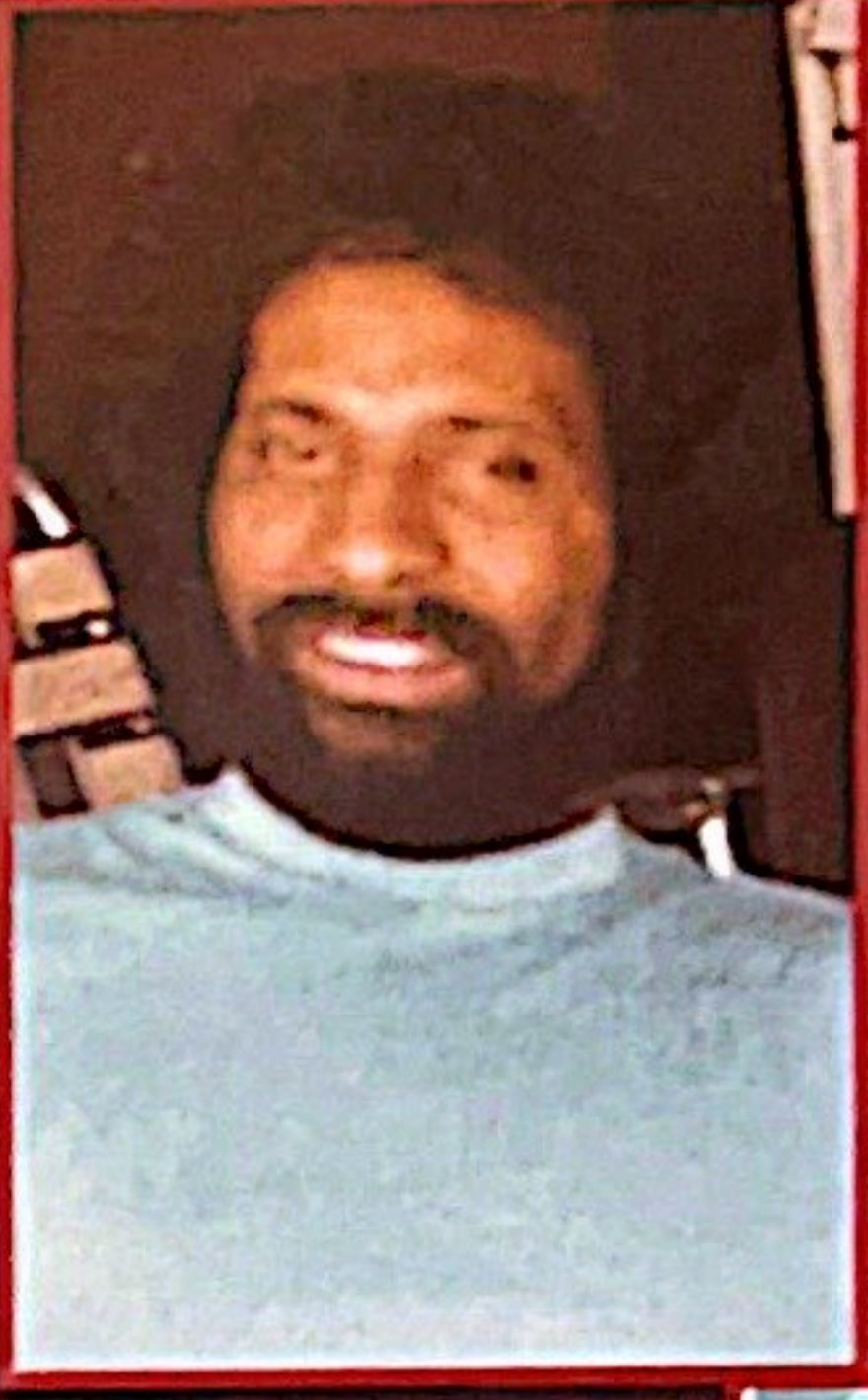
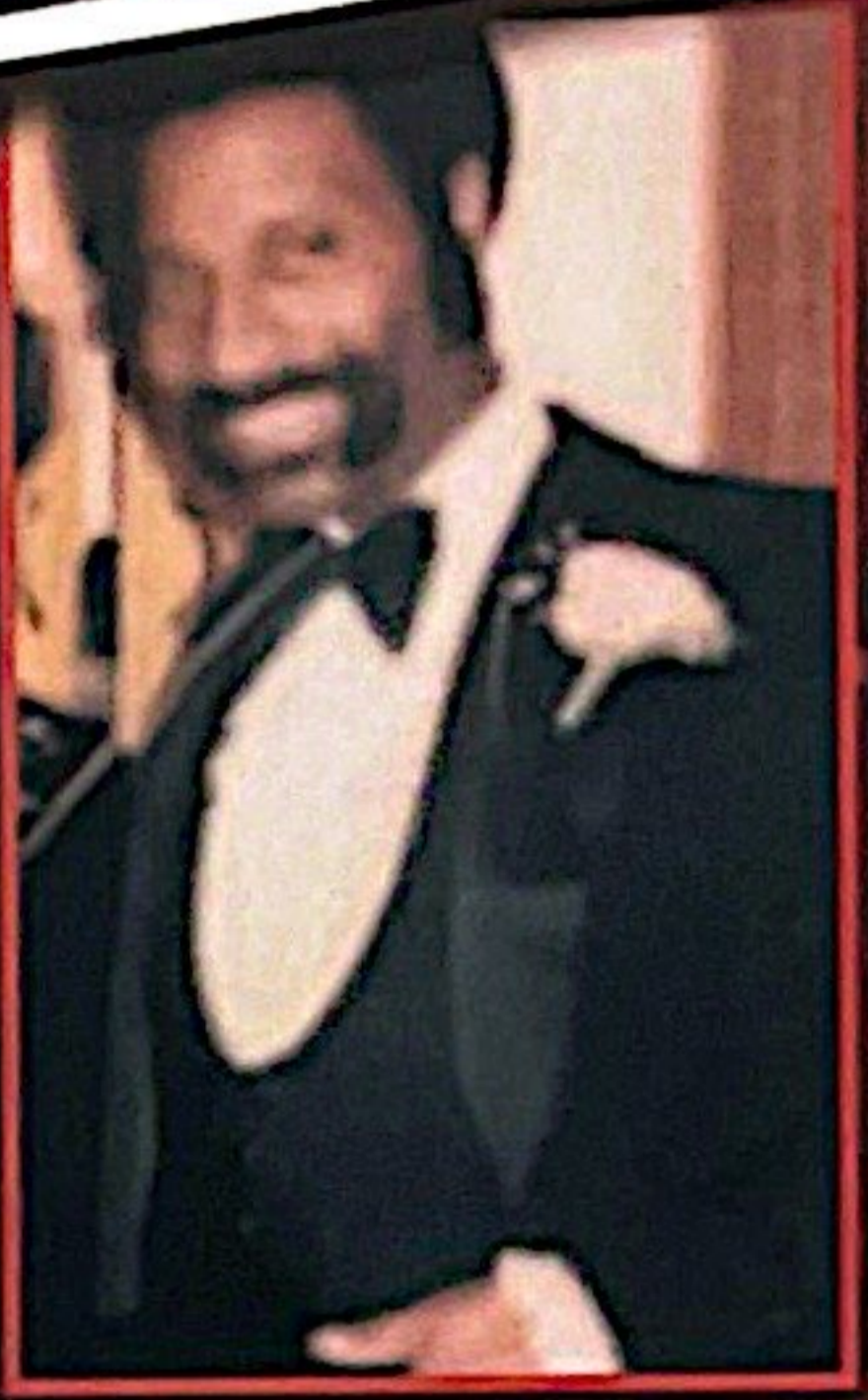
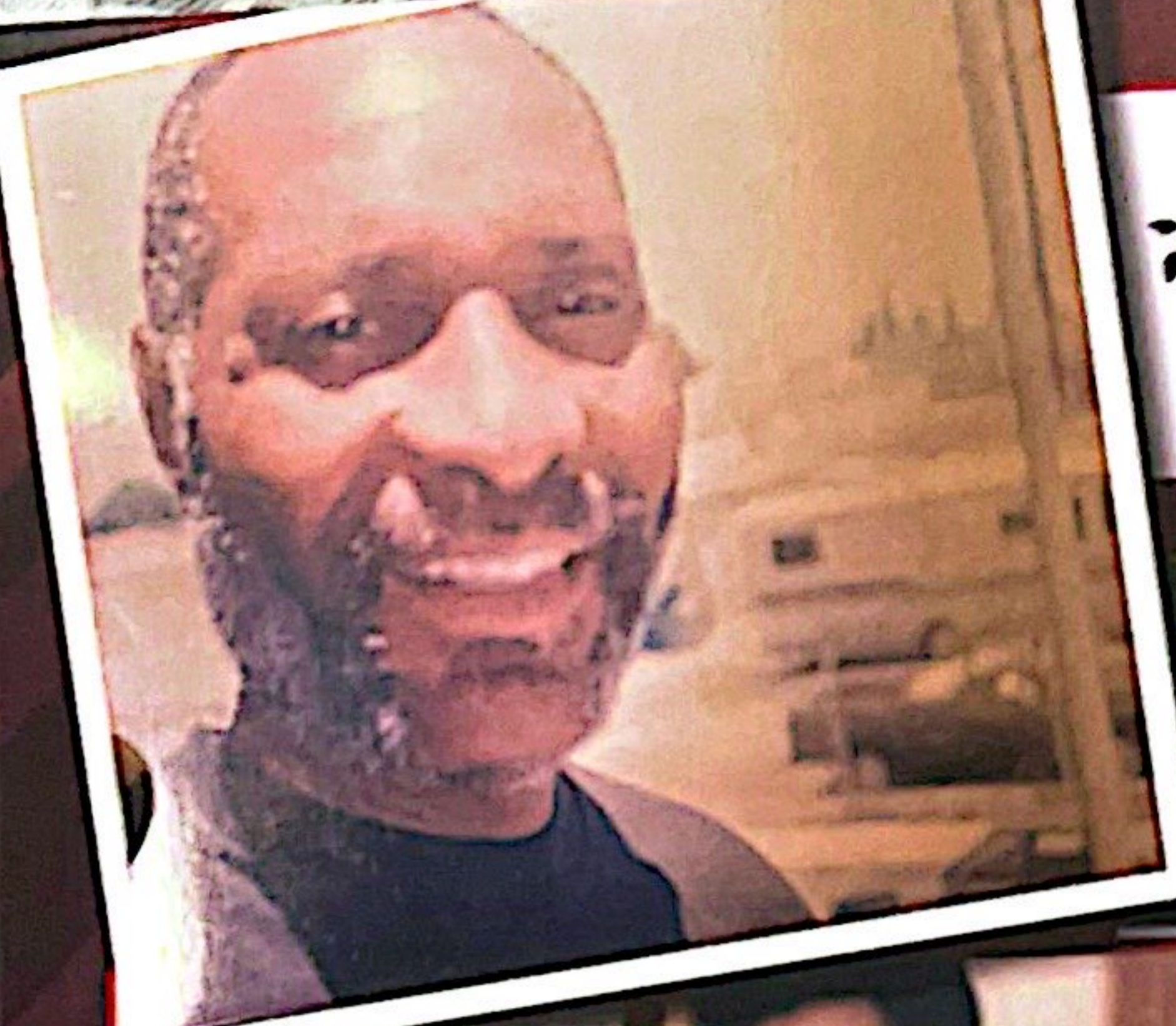

# Special Tributes



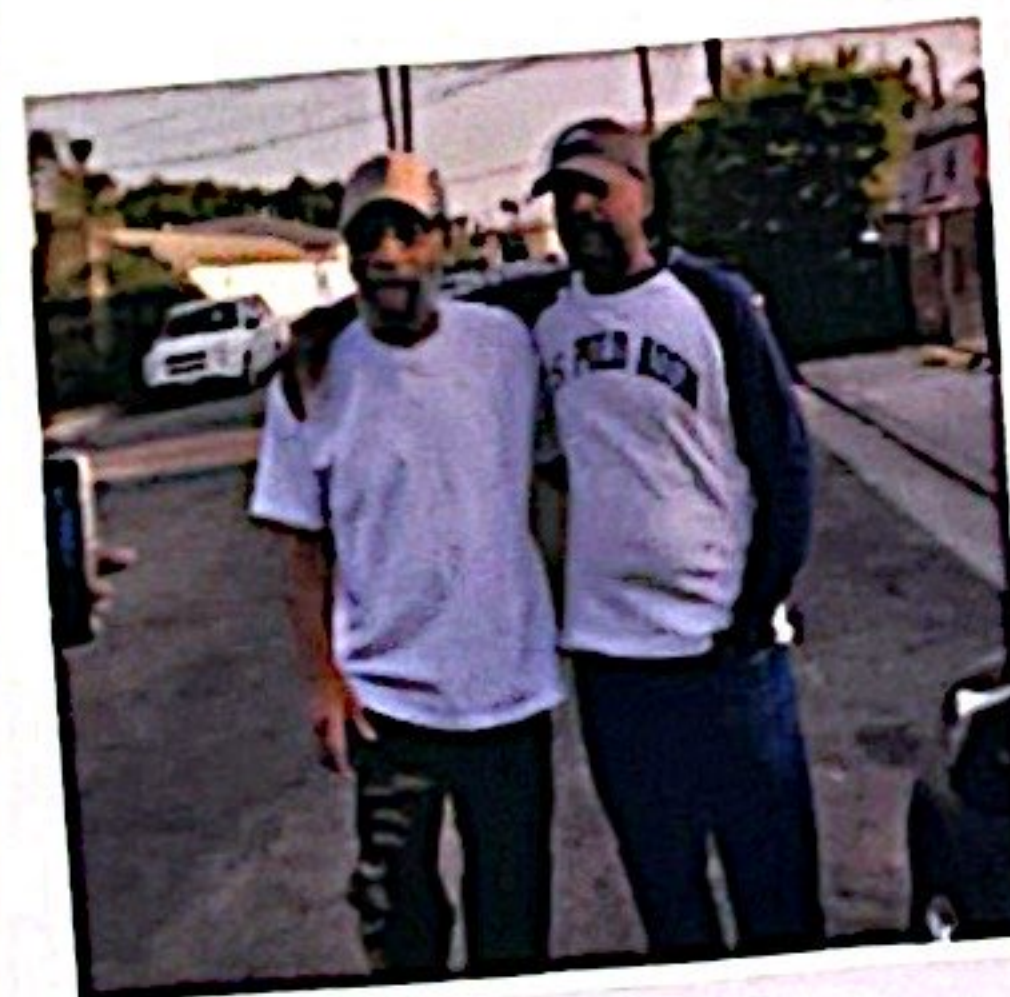
