In 1957, Dwain was united in marriage to the love of his life, Alta Soulek. To this union, three daughters were born, of which all gave him a run for his money, Cathy, Cindy, and Lori.

Dwain had a love and passion for heavy equipment. He was proud to share his experiences of building the Big Bend Dam and Interstate 90 as a heavy equipment operator.
