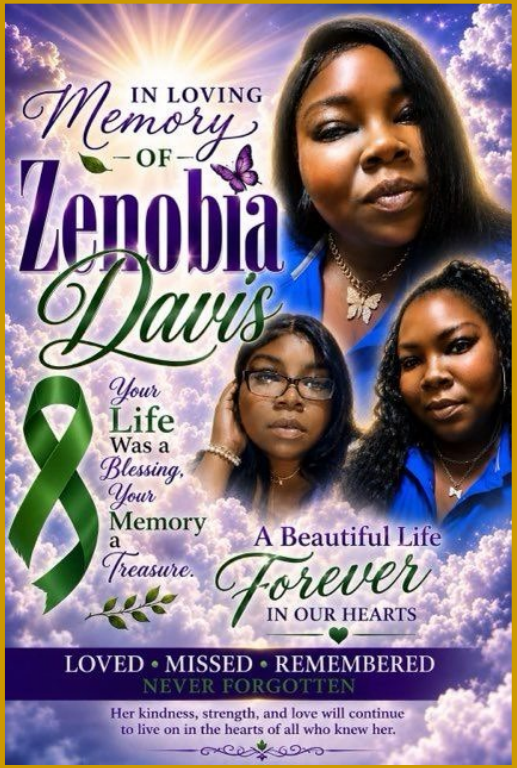
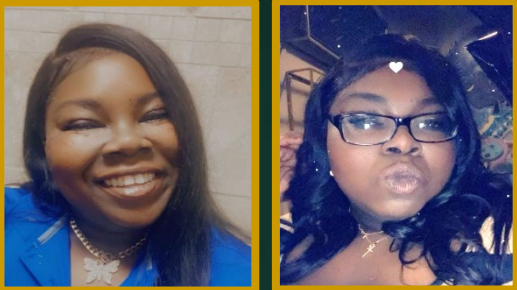
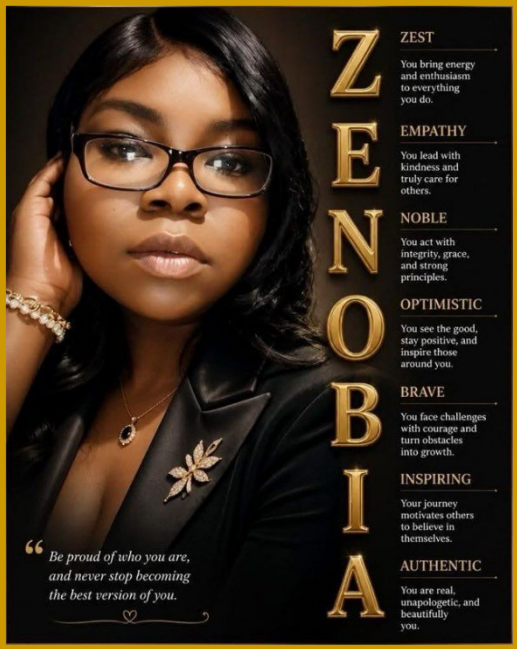
Zenobia was pre-deceased by her mother, Dianna, and father, Elisha; and grandparents, Martha Clark and Christine Davis.
