God is taking care of me... I'm in the shelter of His hands.

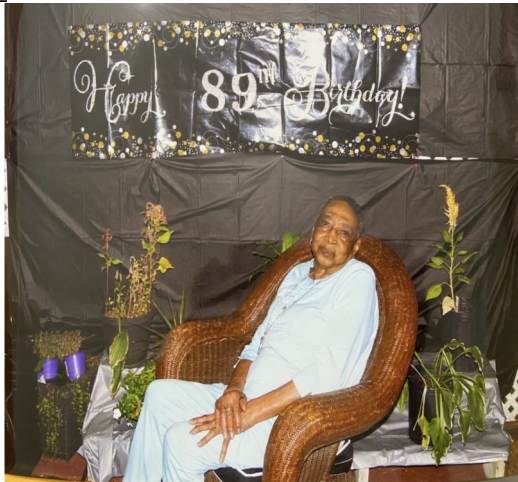
Here there is no sadness, no sorrow, and no pain.
