

On Monday, January 13, 2025, God called devoted husband, beloved father and grandfather, Kelvin Hook, home.

Kelvin was born on October 4, 1956, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to Woodrow Manning of Blythewood, South Carolina and Bertha Mae Hook, of Chapin, South Carolina, who both preceded him in death.

Kelvin was the youngest of five siblings and very proudly raised in the Allegheny section of North Philadelphia. He was educated in the Philadelphia public school system, attending Simon Gratz High School, where he was crowned Prom King alongside his Prom Queen and future wife, Wanda Michele Henderson. They later graduated from the Class of 1974.

Kelvin on many occasions would blushing tell the story of how he met his High School sweetheart and love of his life, Wanda, while "running the streets of North Philly" with her brothers. From that day in 1972 when he gained the courage to ask, "Do I stand a chance?", he would walk from 25th & Allegheny to 16th & Susquehanna to make sure he saw her as often as he could. Kelvin made sure to let their long-time love be known and would humorously say "I was just a poor boy from North Philly". From their union, they were blessed with four daughters: Shanae in 1975, Shakia in 1983, Shatara in 1986 and Shanya in 1995. As Kelvin would say, a house full of girls that drove him crazy. Kelvin deeply loved his family, particularly enjoying the moments spent with his grandchildren, who affectionately referred to him as "Pop-Pop."

Kelvin graduated with a Degree in Accounting from Cheyney University. While holding various positions in the field, his longest tenure was as a CPA at the Community College of Philadelphia. Kelvin had a knack for numbers, and you could often find him working away at a spreadsheet.

An avid sports enthusiast, Kelvin was both a dedicated fan and player. Throughout the 1980s, he played left field for the Philadelphia Cougars Softball team. In his later years, you could catch Kelvin watching his favorite sports teams compete. He would time and again taunt his family and friends about their rivals.

Kelvin had a passion for computer card games and enjoyed watching TV. Whether it was midday or midnight, if he wasn't focused on a game of solitaire, you could find him binge watching crime shows or tuning into the history channel. Kelvin also appreciated a good meal, and while he had too many favorites to choose just one, one thing for sure was his love for his wife's savory cooking.

Kelvin was preceded in death by the love of his life, Wanda Michele Hook, two sisters Renier 'Becky' Hook and Doris Anderson, and brother Roger (Hook) Davis.
