Kim loved to come along to Saskatoon, SK, to pick up groceries. It wasn't far down the road; she would slip into the bunk and would always comment that there was no better sleep than in a moving truck. That job ended in 2000. Then we, together with Norman and Marianne Warkentin, purchased a parts and oilfield supply store.

In 2002, we were blessed to adopt Gary, Sami, and Shy, when the role of a ready-made family started.
