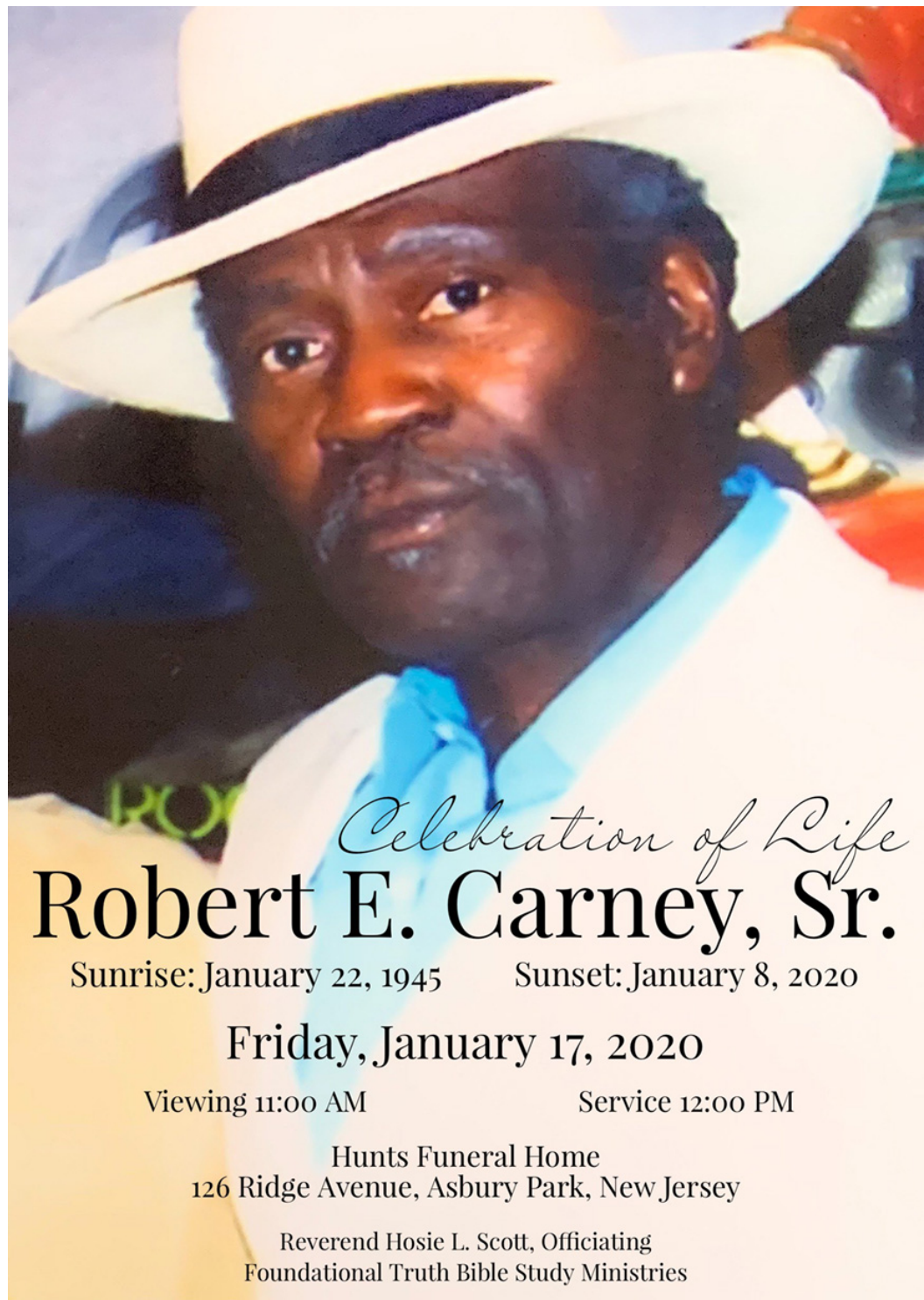

Obituary

Robert E. Carney, Sr. was born in Rock Mountain, North Carolina on January 27, 1945. He departed this life on January 8, 2020. He was born to the late Bemie Moore (deceased 1952) and Sadie Carney (deceased 1977). He was raised by foster parents, Mabel and Fred Davis, in Rocky Mountain, North Carolina.

Robert moved to New Jersey in 1965 at the age of 20. Working at Eddie's Barbershop in Asbury Park for 10 years, he completed an apprenticeship and became a master barber. He later worked as a barber in Archie Barbershop in Neptune. In this profession, Robert was afforded the opportunity to interface and serve many people in the community. He was well known in the community and friends describe him as a generous person always willing to lend helping hands.

His greatest passion was singing. He sang in local night clubs in Asbury Park such as the Orchard Lounge, Big Bills, and The Cuba Club for many years. He began singing with the Broadways where he met Bruce Springsteen. He later travelled with Bruce Springsteen as a backup singer and he also sang with Ray, Goodman, and Brown.

Robert's first marriage was to Edrine Audrey Carney in 1969 (deceased March 18, 2012). To this union was born one child, Robert E. Carney, Jr. and one granddaughter, Aiesha Mckelle.

He leaves to mourn his second wife Joyce Brown Carney (married December 20, 2018) and one step granddaughter, Shardon Denise Palmer.

Robert confessed Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior and joined Foundational Truth Bible Study Ministries in February 2017. He attended bible study diligently and received a certificate of completion for New Members Orientation. He was a valued member of the praise team and used his gift of singing to glorify God.

Robert was predeceased by two sisters, Ruby Davis and Ida Davis and one brother, Larry Davis. He leaves to mourn two sisters Corrine Davis and Mary Mangun of Rocky Mountain, North Carolina.
