As a teacher's journey finds its final share.*


*The classroom walls, a witness to their might,




The "Larry-Don" Excursion Boat, Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri

1952 - 2025*



Carl was preceded in passing by his parents; one daughter, Stephanie Burns; and brother-in-law, Donald Upton.



Following his high school graduation, he would attend College of the Ozarks, obtaining his BSE and later his Master's Degree in Analytic Geometry from Southwest Missouri State, now known as Missouri State University.

Throughout his working years, he taught school in various places around Missouri. In 1992, he was offered a DODDS contract to teach mathematics overseas on
