At times like this I can't help but reflect on things undone and words unsaid, phone calls I put off and events I've missed, all the hugs I should have given, looking back on that last kiss.

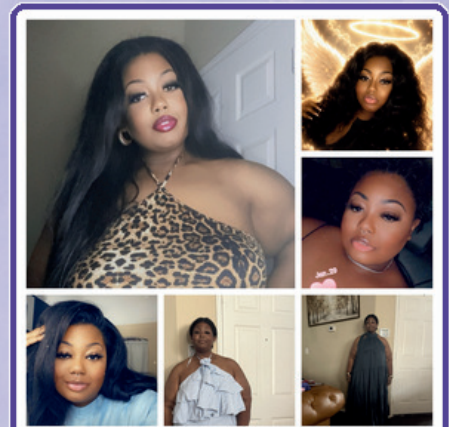
Wishing I was a prophet, I could have given you your flowers. Now I'm stripped of my power, left to regret this horror.
