### Psalms 103:1-5

1 Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. 2 Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits—  
3 who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases,  
4 who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, 5 who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

### John 15:9-17

9 "As the Father has loved Me, so I have loved you. Stay in My love. 10 If you obey My teaching, you will stay in My love. In the same way, I have obeyed My Father's teaching and stay in His love. 11 I have told you these things so My joy may be in you and your joy may be full.

### Colossians 3:12-17

12 God has chosen you. You are holy and loved by Him. So put on tender feelings of pity and kindness. Be humble. Be gentle and patient.  
13 Bear with each other. Forgive each other if someone does wrong to you. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. 14 And most of all, love each other. Love holds everything together in perfect unity. 15 Let the peace of Christ have power over your hearts. You were called to be at peace as one body. Always be thankful. 16 Let the Word of Christ live in you richly. Teach and help one another with all wisdom. Sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God with thankful hearts. 17 Whatever you do or say, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus. Give thanks to God the Father through Him.
