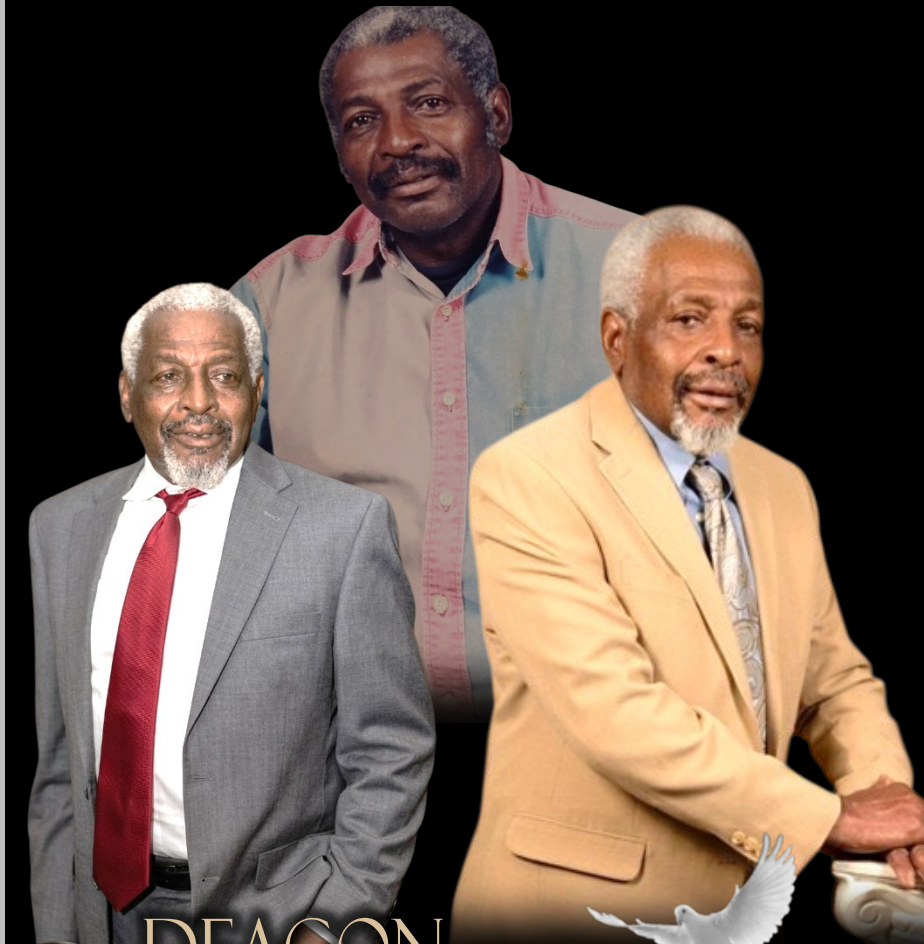

LIFE'S REFLECTIONS

Deacon Abie Jackson, Sr.

Abie "Po-Jack" Jackson was born August 25, 1939, in Yazoo City, Mississippi, to the late Lillie Simpson Jackson and Joe Jackson. He was the youngest of four siblings.

Abie accepted Christ and was baptized at a young age. He was a lifelong member of Chapel Hill Missionary Baptist Church. He lived a life rooted in faith, service, and devotion - to God, family, church, and community. At the time of his death, Abie was one of the longest active members and deacons in the church's history. He was a pillar of strength within the congregation, respected not only for his years of service, but for his unwavering faith, his larger-than-life personality, and his unmistakable voice, both in spirit and volume. He was also a proud lifelong resident of his community, Brick Yard Hill, where he met and married the love of his life, the late Louise Moore Jackson.

Abie lived a life defined by hard work, humility, and craftsmanship. Throughout his life's journey, he held several jobs, but carpentry was his passion. He was self-taught in carpentry and took great pride in building the Jackson family home with his own two hands. This is where he and Louise raised their eight children, as well as some of their grandchildren, and created a lifetime of memories.

Beyond his trade, Abie was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, cousin and friend. He believed in honest work, providing for his family, and keeping his word. He retired from the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) and continued to work part-time thereafter until his health declined in 2025. Abie could be seen driving the commercial street sweeper truck at night while cleaning the parking lots of several commercial businesses throughout Yazoo City. Though his hands are now at rest, the legacy he built remains - in the home he created, the family he raised, and the lives he touched throughout his community and Yazoo City. Many refer to him as a Brick Yard Hill and a Yazoo Community Legend!

He was preceded in death by his mother and father, Lillie and Joe Jackson; beloved wife, Louise Jackson; daughter, Lorina Jackson; granddaughter, Natasha Jackson; grandsons, Omarion Jackson and Tyilyn Buster; sisters: Melvina Woodberry, Hannah Jackson, and Leola Jackson; cousin, John W. Shelton, and sister-in-law, Geneva Lacey.

Abie leaves to cherish his memories, three daughters: Derrie (Melvin) Collins, Tammie (Walter) Toney, and Katrina Jackson; four sons: David Joe Jackson, Terry Jackson, Abie Jackson, Jr., and Michael (Cheryl) Jackson; sixteen (16) grandchildren; many great-grands; special cousins, Henry Tucker, Gloria Garner and Shirley Shelton; sister-in-law, Fannie Mae Hayes; dear friends Patricia and Fred Stuckey; and a host of nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews; cousins, life-long neighbors, and church family.
