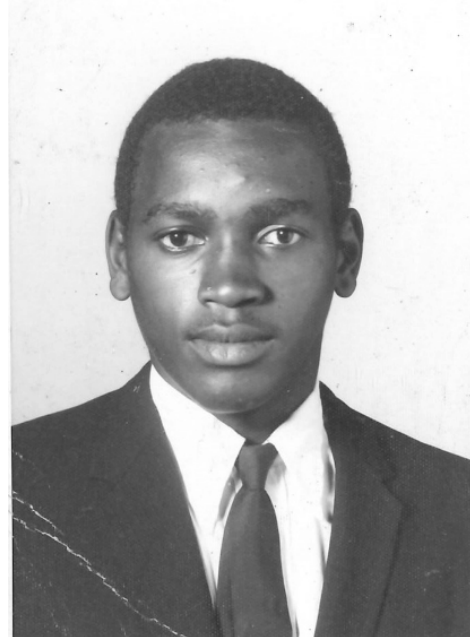
Miss Me But Let Me Go
