


Bruce Terrance Crabb, Sr., age 64, of Coatesville, Pa, passed away unexpectedly on Friday, May 20, 2022, at his home.


Bruce was born on September 5th, 1957, in West Chester, Pa, to the late Ruth Ann Crabb (Nelson) and Donald Earl Crabb.




