

## OBITUARY

Robert Mark "Bob" Daugherty, 69, of Dallas City, Illinois passed away at 9:04 p.m. Wednesday, April 1, 2026 following a courageous ten year battle with Lewy Body Dementia at River Valley Place of Fort Madison, Iowa.

Cremation has been entrusted to Banks & Beals Funeral Home.

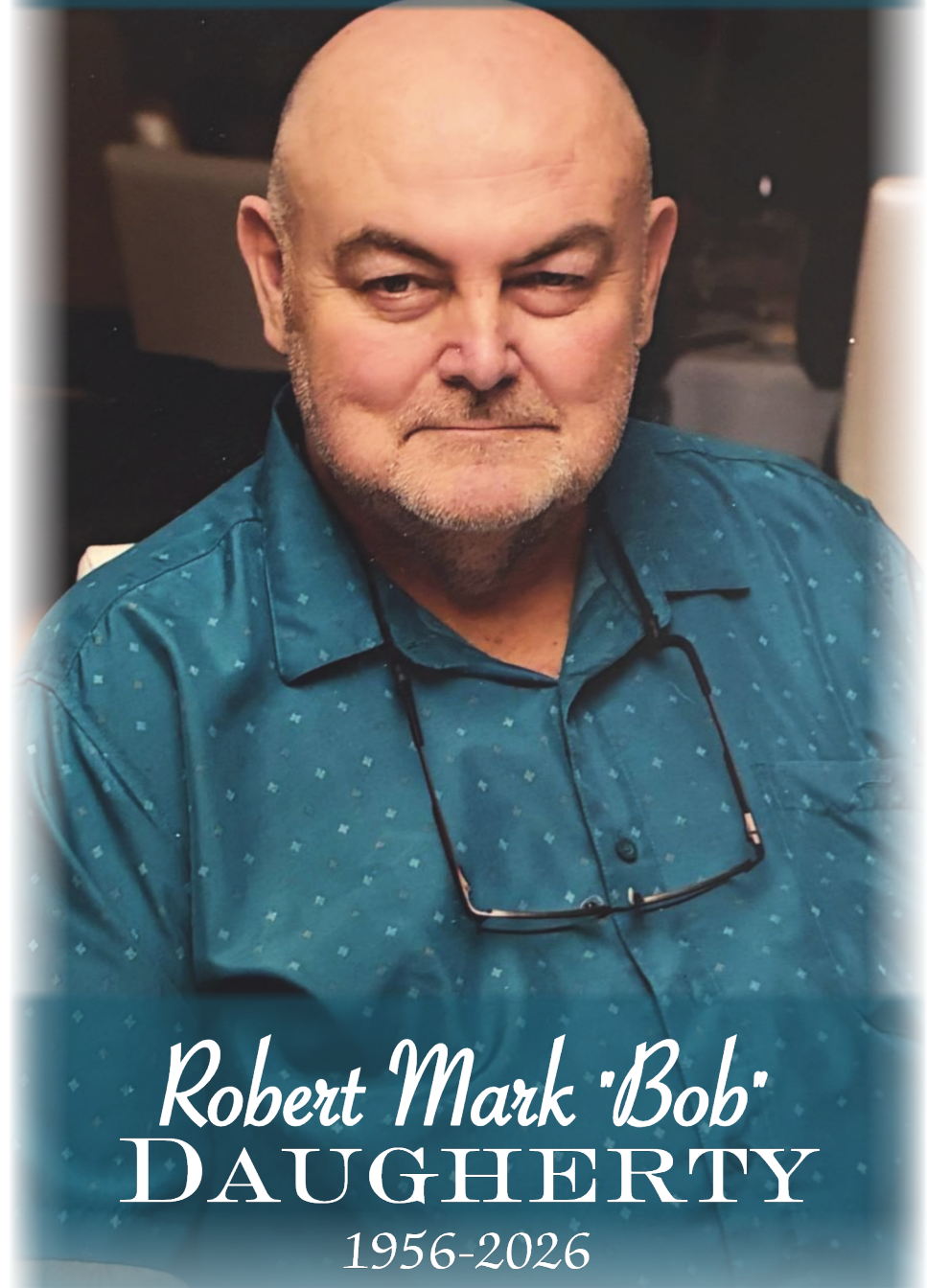
