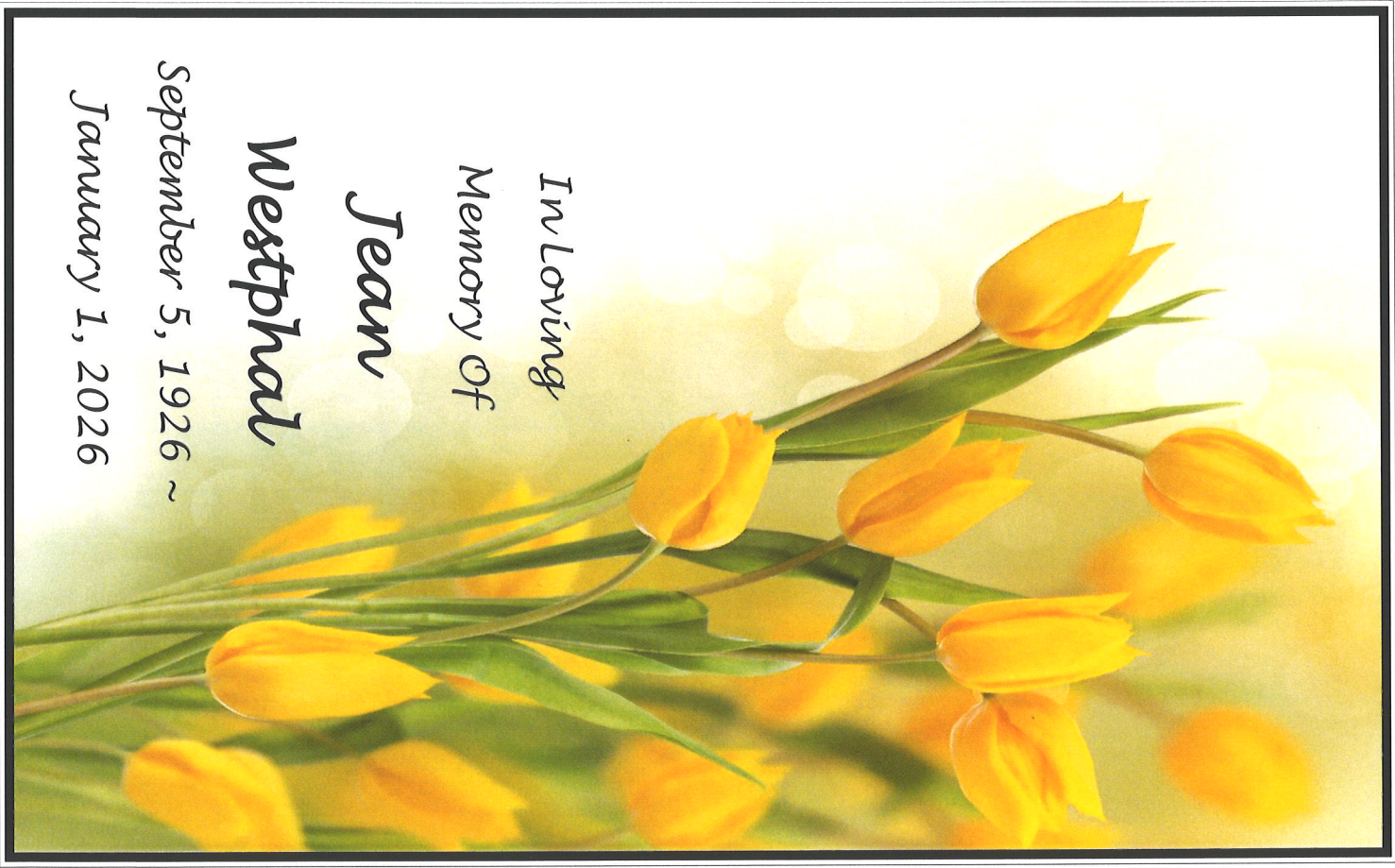


Take pause for just a moment
