

# LIFE Reflection

Reverend Eugene Anderson Sims, a son of the late Rachel Anderson and Stepney Sims, was born on April 4, 1946 in Moncks Corner, South Carolina. He was the second of four children to this union. He departed this life on Tuesday, May 27, 2025 in Charleston, SC.

Eugene was a 1964 graduate of Berkeley Training High School. He attended South Carolina State College (now University) and graduated from South Carolina Area Trade (now Denmark Technical College). He later earned his Master of Theology Degree from East Coast Seminary in Panama City, Florida.

He joined Grace Reformed Episcopal Church at an early age. After moving to Columbia, SC, he joined Temple of Zion Baptist Church where he became a Deacon until he was called into the ministry.

On June 22, 1968, he married Jacqueline Carole Harris of Columbia, SC. This union was blessed with two sons, David Anderson Sims and Davon Sims.

He retired from the United States Postal Service after 31 years of dedicated service.

He continued what he loved best and that was preaching! He served as Pastor of St. Paul Baptist Church, Columbia, SC; Assistant Rector of New St. Thomas R.E. Church, Columbia, SC; and Rector of Holy Rock R.E. Church, McCormick, SC, Calvary R.E. Church, St. Stephen, SC and Zion R.E. Church, Edisto, SC.

He loved to fish, garden, sing and watch Westerns.

Eugene was preceded in death by: a son, Anthony Terry, a grandson, Antonio Terry, and a brother, Stephney (ST) Sims, Jr.
