Obituary

Louise "Lou" Glover was born June 16, 1951, in Covington, Ky to the late William "Mousie" Marshall, Sr. and Armania "Minnie Lee" Glover. Louise was called home at the tender age of 73 years old on Saturday October 5, 2024.

Born and raised in Covington, KY, Louise attended Our Savior Catholic School and Lincoln Grant High School. Life had other plans for Louise so she allowed her love for food and cooking to guide her career path. Spending 13 years with Children's Hospital as a short order cook for their Rainbow Room. She later joined her elder sisters at St. Elizabeth Hospital Nutritional Service until her retirement in 2011.

Louise was a loving and devoted member of her family. Her infectious smile, spunky personality, and witty jokes kept the fun and laughter circulating at every family event from Family Reunions to small get togethers at her home. She made friends everywhere she went, from her physicians, nurses, and receptionist at her doctor's appointments to the cashiers at Kroger from her daily shopping trips to catch her deals. Pouring those same lessons into her children and family by being an example of "you treat people how you would want them to treat you or the people you care about". She stressed the importance of an education to every young person she met and never shied away from giving tough love when needed.

Her love surpassed kind words and a listening ear, transforming into action. You may come hungry, lost, weighed down by your problems and leave with a full stomach, a full heart, and a laugh to get you through the day. Her love, laughter, and firecracker wit left lasting impressions, not just on her family and friends but every person she encountered.

Even through one of the most mentally and physically trying times of her life November 7th, 2022 when she was diagnosed with stage 1 Lung Cancer. Though the news earth shattering and the road ahead very hard, with a tough surgery removing part of her lung, followed by aggressive radiation and infusions she remained her strong, funny, and loving self. With plenty of sad days and trying moments it was the love and support of her family, that firecracker wit and fighter spirit that helped her prevail and on April 5th, 2024 she had won her battle with lung cancer!!!
