Mamie Lee Young was born on October 23, 1940, to the late James Jones and Wynona Quarles-Jones in Plum Branch, South Carolina. The family moved to Philadelphia, PA when Mamie and her sister Betty were young.

Mamie received her education through the Public School System and graduated from William Penn High School. And furthered her education attending Hahnemann Nursing School, graduating with high honors.

Mamie at one time was a member of Parham Chapel Methodist and Laymens Church. She later joined Mt. Pisgah A.M.E. Church over five years ago, under the Pastorate of Reverend Jay B. Broadnax.

Mamie was employed at the Veterans Administration Hospital until she retired. She later came out of retirement and worked for Parkway Central Library until her final retirement. She was a true activist along with her friend Delores Lewis. They worked with the National Coalition of Blacks for Reparations.

Mamie married John Huntley and from this union, their son John Huntley, Jr., was born, later in life married Thomas Young who preceded her in death. Mamie loved to travel, and she traveled all over the world.

Mamie's sister, Betty Fisher, preceded her in death. Mamie leaves to cherish her memory: her son, John Huntley, Jr., one niece, Rnita Fisher; two grandchildren, Alicia, and Denzel; one God-Sister, Maxine Boatwright; Travis & Sierra Skidmore, who were neighbors who were dedicated to Mamie's needs. They were her guardian angels. And a faithful lawyer, Olufolaji Ajibola Fadeyibi and his wife who was by her side through the years, and a host of family and friends.
