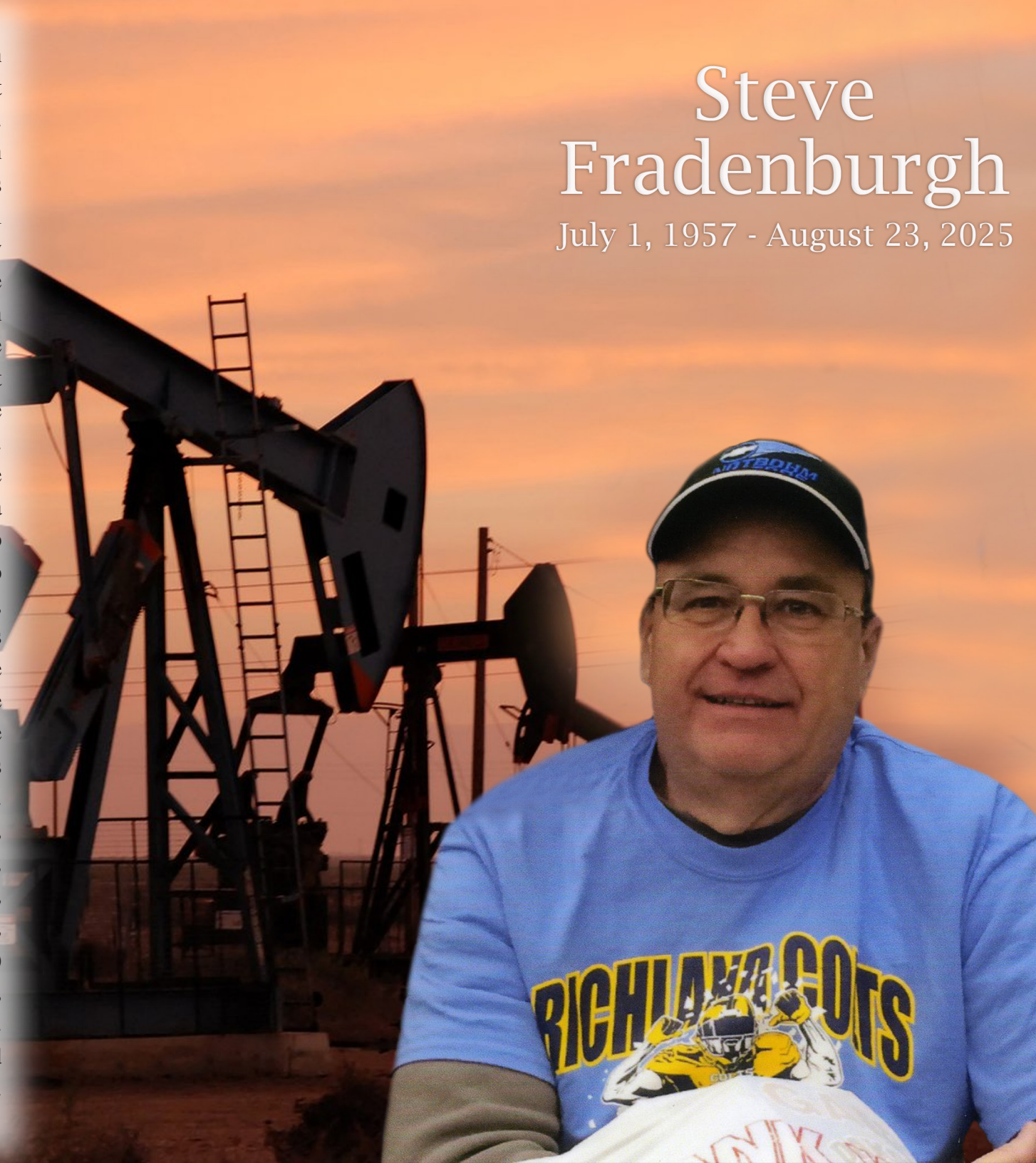


Steve Fradenburgh
