# Roy “Red” Wayne Bryson

Roy “Red” Wayne Bryson, 85, of Sedalia, MO, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on Friday, November 21, 2025, at his home. He was born on April 5, 1940, in Sedalia, the son of Roy Lee Bryson and Mary E. (Glazebrook) Bryson, who preceded him in death.
