His Story

Jonathan Lane was born to Eleanor Lane in St. Louis, Missouri on November 16, 1958 at Homer G. Phillips Hospital. He had four siblings, two brothers and two sisters: Angela, Flora, Orlandos, and Clifton Lane.

He received his early education from Carr-Lane Elementary, also known as Carr-Lane Visual and Performing Arts Middle School. In addition to this, he attended Rock Jr. Highschool before moving to Montclair N.J. and finishing his schooling there. After school, he joined the U.S. Air Force and was sent to Germany where he was the youngest Airmen in the Command Center as a Command and Control Specialist. Once he returned to the states, he attended Newark Community College for about a year before enlisting in the Navy. He rose to the rank of Second-Class Petty officer and received an Expeditionary medal for action in the Middle East. After some time, he worked as a school police officer within the School District of Philadelphia until his retirement.

Jonathan was preceded in death by his mother (Eleanor), his brothers (Orlandos and Clifton Lane), his niece (Reba Burgess), and his nephew (Aaron David) .
