“B-Dawgs Story”

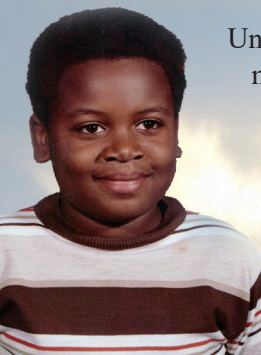
