Gerald/Geraldine enjoyed her life and outlived almost all her siblings, reaching a golden year of 78. Those siblings left to celebrate with her today are; Rosalee, Priscilla, Deborah, Albert, her three grandchildren, and one grandson-in-law, with eight great-grandchildren.

Geraldine's 1st career was in nursing; she became a License Practical Nurse (LPN), working in most of the nursing homes in Baltimore City, including those within the Baltimore County areas. Unfortunately, she sustained a significant knee injury when a patient became hostile and became the reason for her departure from that field of work, only to find her true love; becoming a walking horse jockey. Gerald/Geraldine's friends would know her primarily from working on the racetracks; she worked at every major racetrack, from Florida to New Jersey, eventually retiring from the Pimlico race track around 1996. I went to every Preakness with her from 1990 to 2004, always hanging in the inside field and having fun.

Geraldine's White accomplishment is becoming a mother to two children, awarded with three grandchildren; outstanding achievement live to see eight great-grandchildren. These are real-life accomplishments that matter(s). Throughout life, she was a friend to many, always lending that helping hand, always a smile to be remembered. But life takes toil upon us, and for years Gerald/Geraldine suffered from COPD (Congestive Pulmonary Disease) and Renal requiring dialysis's 3-times weekly until her life ended.

On 9 February 2023, it was time for Gerald/Geraldine White to go home, or as we say, to visit the family at the Family Center Welcoming. She is loved and genuinely missed by all she leaves behind, but we must rejoice her, for she survived many family members, friends and trying times.
