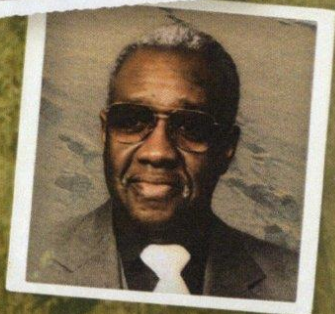

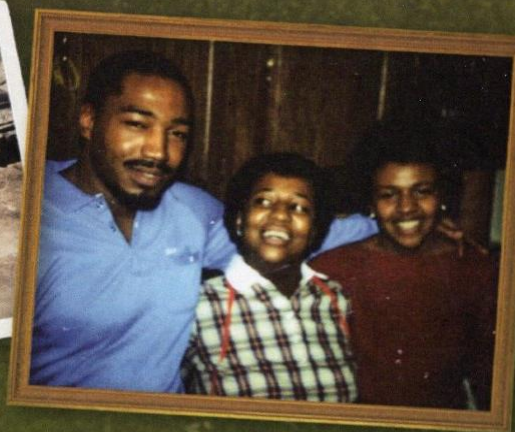

Markus loved his family and always made himself available whenever needed. His pride and joy was his daughter, Trissy, whom he would brag about to no end.

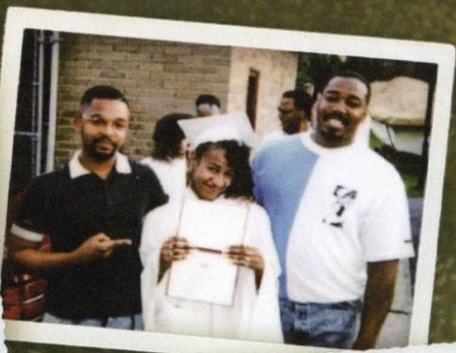
He was gifted with an amazing spirit, always upbeat, loved to have fun, and was "The Life of the Party." Markus never complained about his illness.

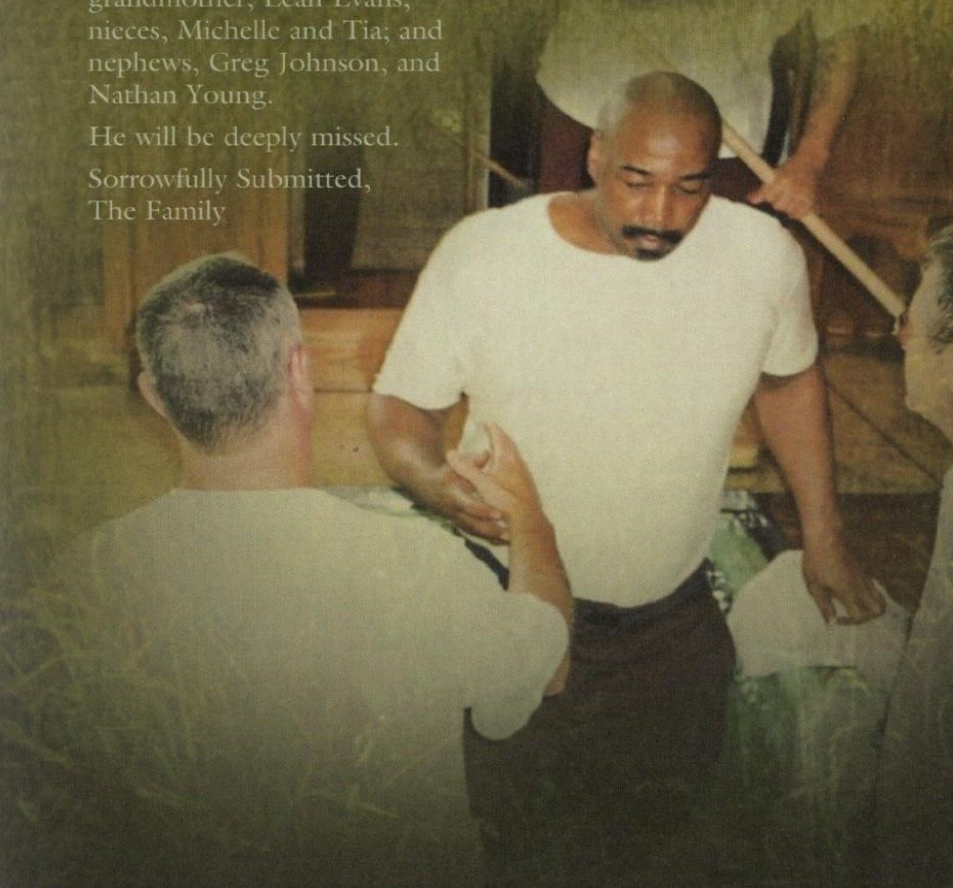
