Charlotte's Indian name was Ni-Hopa (Pretty Woman) and was fondly known by her grandkids as "Smoker Gram".

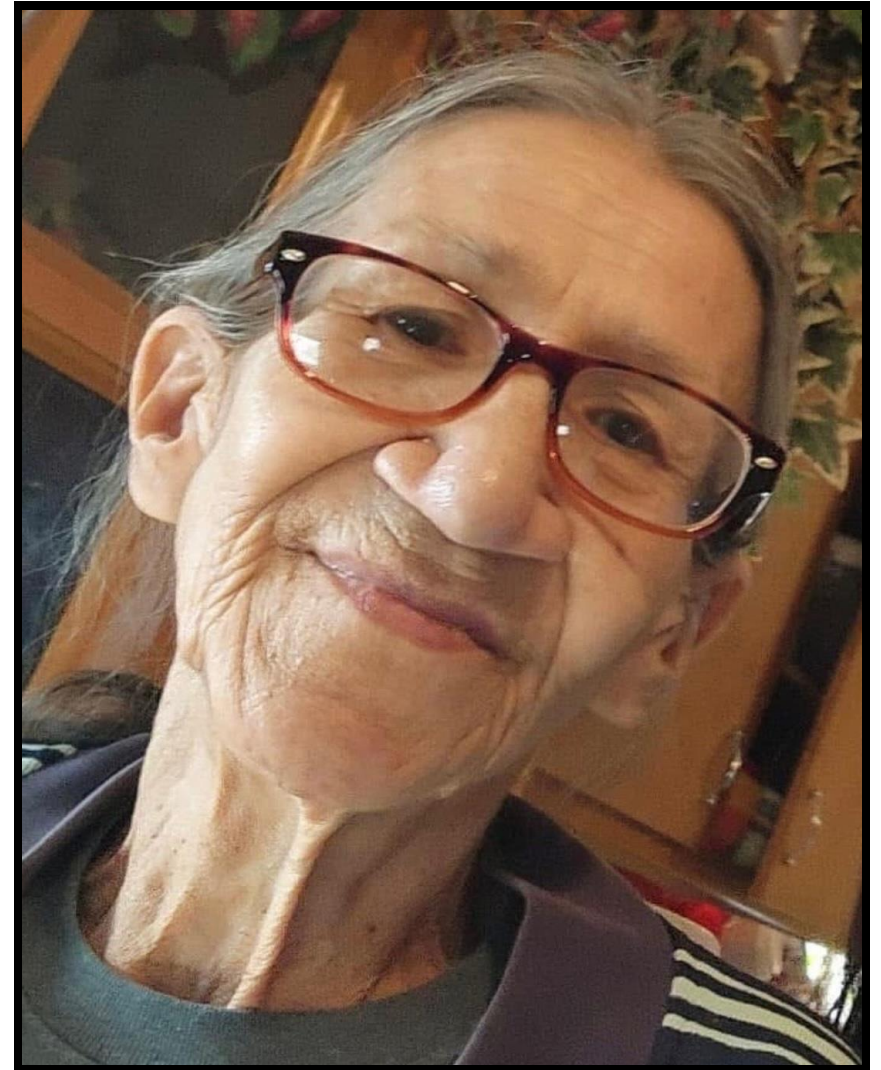
