Obituary

Queenie Christine Booker-Paylor, affectionately known as Christine and Chris, was born on November 7, 1927 to Samuel Booker and Queenie Pitts Booker in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. She was the first born of their children. As the eldest child of their eight children, Christine was responsible for helping her mother maintain the household and tending to her younger siblings. That kind of special responsibility would help her to shape her later life. It was in Anne Arundel County where Christine began her formal education.

In the mid-1930s, the family moved to West St. in South Baltimore. Christine continued her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools ultimately graduating from Frederick Douglass High School. Some years later the Bookers would again move, this time to Gwynn Falls Parkway. She extended her education by attending what was then the Coppin State Teachers' College. There Christine earned the Bachelor of Science degree in Education.

Reared in a Christian home, she accepted Christ as her personal Savior at John Wesley United Methodist Church when the church was located, at that time, in South Baltimore. As a young active member, she attended Sunday school, joined the Junior Choir and the Junior Usher Board. Christine loved the Lord and enjoyed participating in numerous church organizations and committees.

As a young adult, Christine worked as a store clerk at Sandler's' Grocery Store. While working at Sandler's, she met and fell in love with John D. Paylor, Sr. They married on December 18, 1950 and lived in Northwest Baltimore most of their adult lives with their children, Evelyn, Deanna, Rose, Angela, and John Jr. Christine's house was always full of people. You never knew who was going

to stop for a visit. Any time someone stopped by, you could always catch Christine wearing her moo moo or house dress while in the kitchen cooking delicious meals or writing a church paper.

Professionally, Christine was a dedicated educator in and outside of the classroom. She started her career with Baltimore City Public Schools in May of 1951. She taught numerous elementary school students at Alexander Hamilton Elementary School, # 145. Her former students would always recognize her and be excited to see her while she was out and about. They would always tell her she taught them and how they loved her as their teacher. After retiring from the Baltimore City Public School System in 1984, she continued to mentor new teachers at James McHenry Elementary School in the Baltimore City mentor program.

Not only was Christine passionate about education but she also loved helping in the community. She volunteered and was secretary of the Callaway Garrison Association in her neighborhood, and she was very active in her church community. There was not a committee, organization or group Christine was not a part of at the John Wesley United Methodist Church. She was a communion steward, choir member, lay speaker, trustee, hospitality member, kitchen diplomate and a bereavement and restoration committee member, to name a few. Christine was a part of almost every committee, organization or group at John Wesley United Methodist Church. Needless to say, she left her mark on John Wesley United Methodist Church. Her husband used to call her "Miss John Wesley". She was enthusiastic about serving the Lord and was a member of John Wesley United Methodist Church for over 70 years. Christine not only enjoyed serving the Lord, she enjoyed shopping with family and close friends, traveling and good conversations that were mainly about the Lord or the school system.

Christine is predeceased by her husband John Paylor Sr. and is survived by sister Inez Crowder, daughters Evelyn Perry (Rick), Deanna Wilson, Rose Conaway, Angela Jones (Steve), grandchildren Nichelle Beasley, Troy Wilson, Nicole Swann (Kenneth), Keith Tate (Melissa), Joi Randall, Kaci Conaway, John Paylor III, great grandchildren Shyrelle Wilson, Khari Swann, Khameron Swann and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends. Her son John Paylor, Jr. and great grandson Troy Wilson, Jr. also preceded Christine in death.
