Obituary

Alonzo Brown was born on October 13, 1930, and peacefully transitioned on June 5, 2026, going home to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Alonzo was born to the union of the late Moses and Bessie Brown in Laurel, Mississippi. He was born alongside his twin brother, Alphonzo. At a very young age, Alonzo accepted Christ as his Savior and was baptized at St. Paul United Methodist Church in Laurel, Mississippi. His faith remained a guiding force throughout his life.

Alonzo was united in Holy Matrimony to Vera. To this union, one daughter, Monifa (Monica). Throughout his lifetime, Alonzo resided in several states, including Mississippi, Ohio, California, and Texas. After relocating to Cincinnati, Ohio, in the 60's by way of his uncle Major (Leo) and Louise Williams. He became a faithful member of Calvary United Methodist Church, where he worshipped until the church closed. Following its closure, he joined Allen Temple AME Church under the leadership of Reverend Alphonse Allen.
