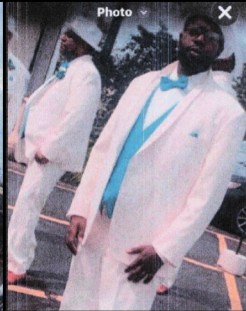
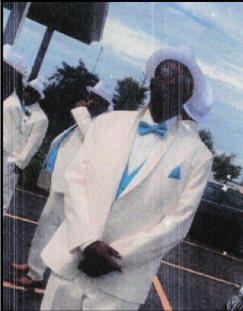
Lavelle shared a special bond with his siblings, Michelle Harris, George Harris, Melissa Coleman, Joann Coleman Long, and Sharon Turner.

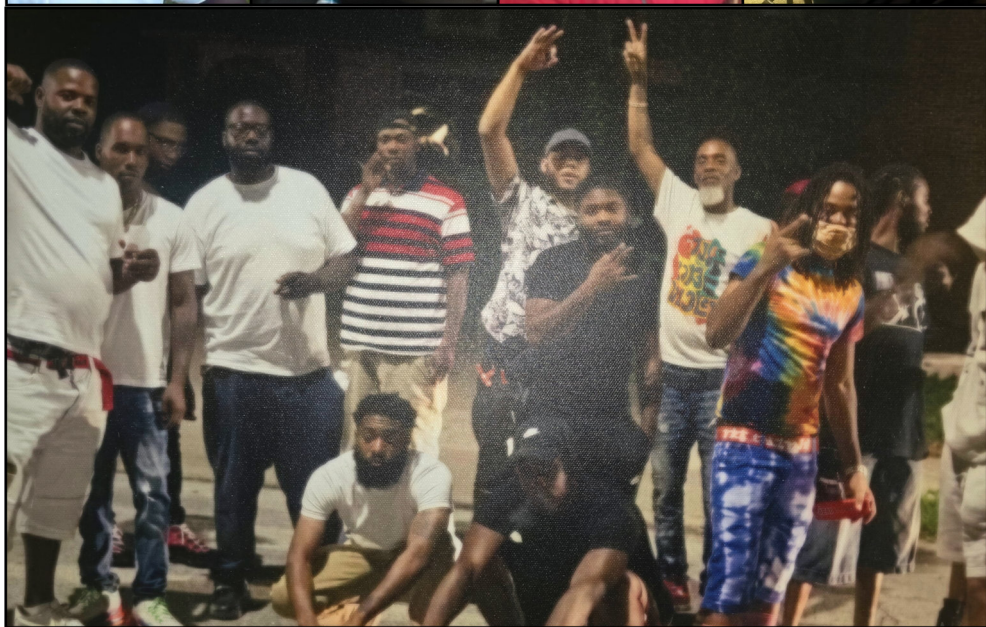
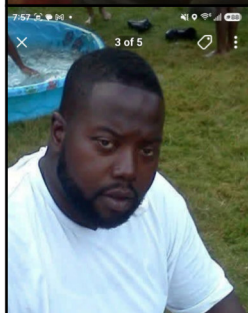
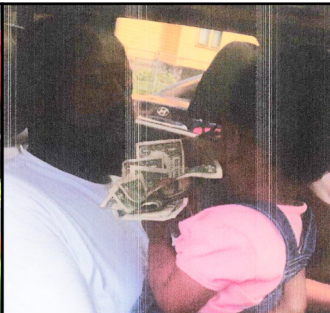
He was preceded in death by his father, Alfred Coleman Jr; and grandparents, Thelma Harris, Alfred Coleman, and Jennie Coleman.
