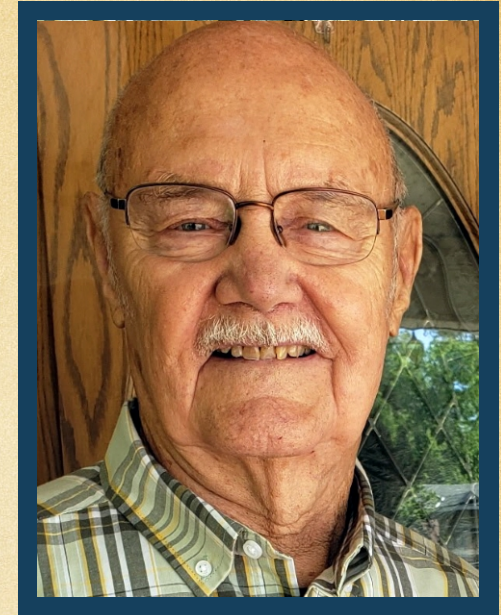

Allen Walter Jahn, 88, of McPherson, KS, peacefully passed away on Monday, May 4, 2026, surrounded by family at Hospice House, Hutchinson.

He was born on July 4, 1937, in Newton, KS, the son of Arthur Albert and Dora Sophia (Otte) Jahn. He attended Immanuel Lutheran Parochial School through the 8th grade and graduated from Canton High School in 1955. On May 24, 1957, Allen was united in marriage to Barbara Jean Jantz at the Emmanuel Mennonite Church near Galva, KS.

Allen worked as an installer for Modern Insulating, worked in the maintenance department at Sterling Drug, and retired as a

Allen always kept a maintained yard and created thoughtful light displays to celebrate each holiday.
