righteousness for his name's sake.*

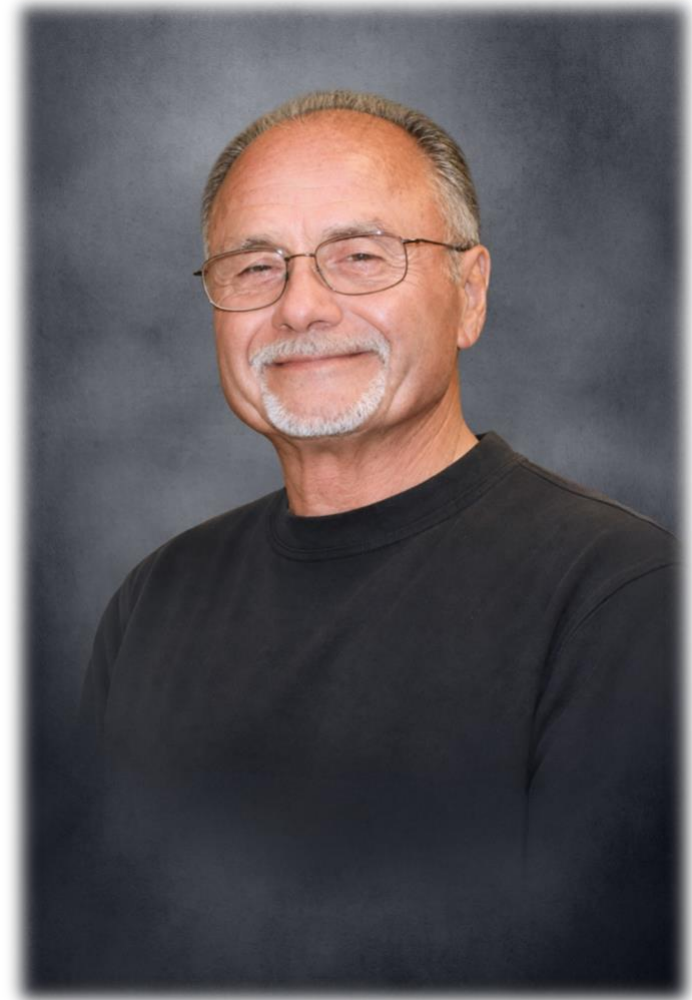
*Yea, though I walk through the valley of the
