

Adee Cook Obituary

Adee Cook, 93, of Tinton Falls, New Jersey passed away on Thursday, June 16, 2016, at Jersey Shore University Medical Center, Neptune, New Jersey. He was born on November 20, 1922 in Jackson, North Carolina to Norman and Pattie Cook.

After leaving North Carolina his family moved to Freehold and then to Allaire, New Jersey. Adee graduated from Manasquan High School in Manasquan, New Jersey.
