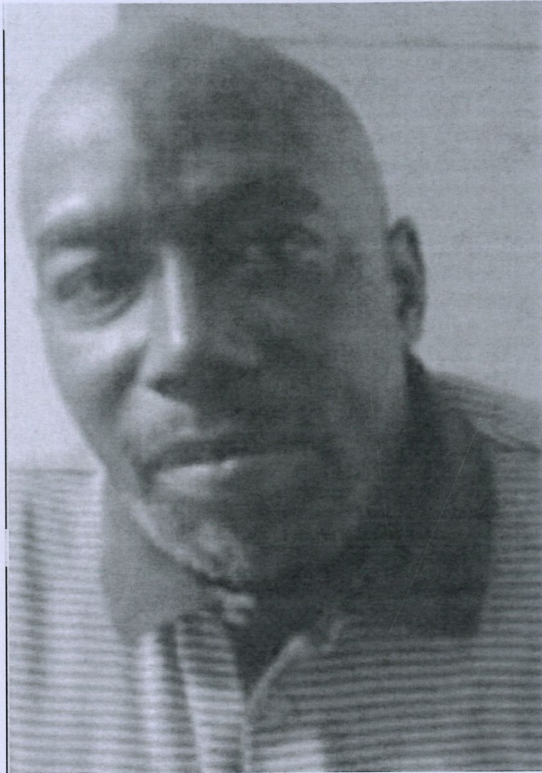

He truly had a hobby of raising pigeons. He had his own pigeon coop in his backyard. He also enjoyed shooting pool. He truly loved and respected females.

Joe L. Parker transitioned on Monday, October 16, 2023 and went home to be with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

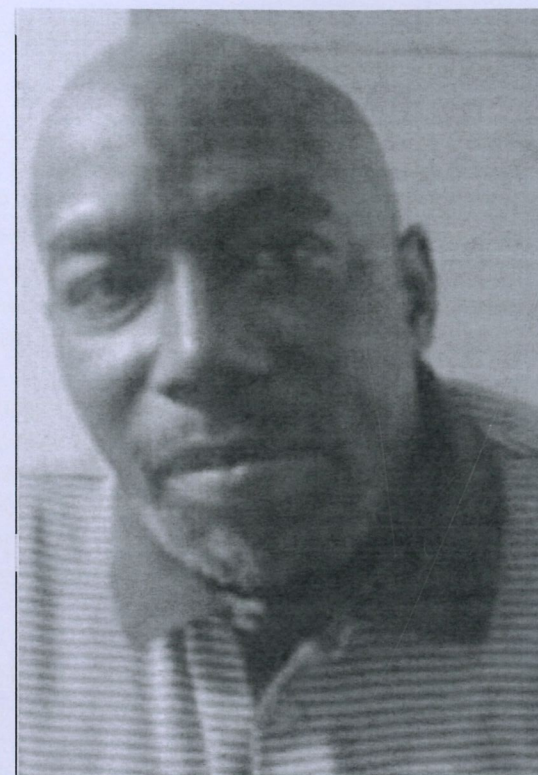
Joe L. Parker. You were good to us. You will always be in my memories. You will truly be missed.
