Luther Martin was born October 12, 1953, to Barbara Jean Vines Martin and Luther Carlton Martin, Sr. He departed this life and passed into eternal Glory on June 5, 2026. Luther was one of five children born and had two siblings that preceded him in death, a sister Danell Martin, and a brother Jamie Martin.

Luther attended and graduated from the Cleveland Public Schools. Luther enlisted and served in the US Army for a short period of time and then returned to his hometown of Cleveland.

Luther spent 35 years incarcerated, which transformed his life in ways that only God could have made possible. Luther loved the Lord and talked about him constantly; he was a faithful servant of Lord until his death. Luther gave his life to Christ and began studying the word and sharing with many others. He completed Boyce Bible College, which was part of The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 2001, and was part of many prison ministry initiatives while he served time. Luther became a vessel of God and by allowing the Lord to speak to others through him, many lives have been transformed to follow Christ.

Luther was most impactful with his involvement in the EMBARK Program and Kairos Ministry. Luther's unflinching love and devotion to Jesus touched the lives of everyone he encountered.

Luther leaves to cherish his memory a sister Eunice Martin (Bonnie), a brother Marvin Martin, a son, Jamil Bunner Sr., a daughter Janeen Martin as well as grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and many other family members and many close friends who served with him in ministry.

Luther was blessed to have a special niece, Karmika Martin who was his devoted caregiver throughout his illness.
