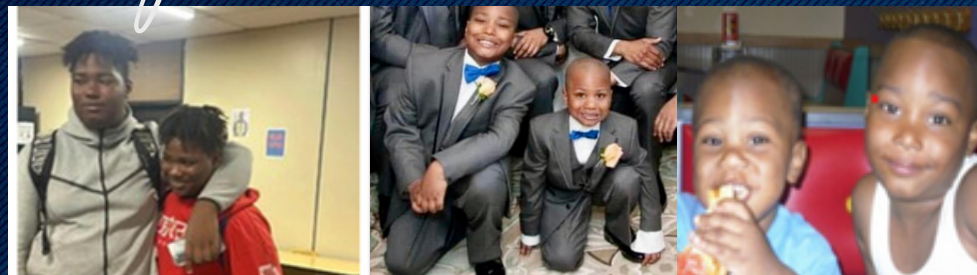

Makhi Terry Darrah Boston was born on May 2nd, 2005, to his loving parents, Zakia Cooper-Boston and Terry Lee Boston Sr. An adventurer from the beginning, it was clear that Makhi's interests were in "All-American Football". Makhi was a natural athlete and was passionate about the game of football. As a young child, he started Pop Warner football for the South End Titans and the Boston Bengals. He quickly became one of the best players on the team. He continued perfecting his craft, playing for the Weymouth Wildcats and throughout High School for the premier Brockton Raiders and the Brockton Boxers. Makhi recently graduated from Brockton High School and was offered a lineman position at Morgan State University in Maryland. He was set to attend in the upcoming school year. Although his life was cut short, Makhi dreamed of playing in the NFL and was determined to make that dream a reality. He attended numerous leagues, including "The Trench King Challenge" in Atlanta and Texas. He dominated the field everywhere he played. Dedicated to becoming the best player throughout his athletic career, Makhi won over 15 athletic trophies and four gold medals, earning the title of top offensive lineman of Massachusetts. Makhi was a very fun and enthusiastic young man. His family and friends loved and cherished him. There is no doubt that his future ahead was bright.

Terry Lee Boston Jr. was born at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts, on October 19, 2007. As a child, TJ. was always happy and vibrant; some people described him as a big teddy bear with a smile that could light up a room. When he was five, he immediately followed in his big brother's steps and became obsessed with football, playing for teams such as the South End Titans, the Boston Bengals and Weymouth Wildcats. Some of TJ's favorite activities were playing basketball and football, tap dancing, playing video games, and cruising with his family. TJ was set to enter the 10th grade at Brockton High School and had just made the varsity team still carrying his brother's number: 75. His teachers and friends described him as intelligent and hilarious, and his friends loved him for his clever jokes and bright sense of humor. TJ's life was brief, but the impression he left on the lives of others will never be forgotten. He was the sweetest, most loving soul and an absolute joy. Even though TJ was taken from us much too soon, He was able to teach us so much in such a short amount of time, namely love. He always said, "Family First," and always did his part to ensure the well-being of his family. TJ's spirit and energy will be missed.

TJ and Makhi's sudden deaths shocked everyone who knew them. They were healthy, happy and had their whole lives ahead of them. Their deaths remind us that life is precious and can be taken from any of us at any time. We should cherish the moments we have with our loved ones and never take them for granted.

TJ and Makhi are preceded in death by their grandmother, the late Minister Quencella Morgan Cooper; their grandmother, the late Evangeline Boston; their grandfather, the late Terry Davis; and their uncles, Tijani Darrah Cooper and Johnny Davis. They are survived by their loving mother, Zakia Cooper Boston; father, Terry Lee Boston Sr.; sisters, Makaila and Saanai Boston. Their grandfather, Ralph H. Cooper; and grandmother, Shondell Davis. They leave to cherish their memories, their one and only niece Milan Jackson, many relatives, including aunts, uncles, hundreds of cousins, classmates, and friends.
