

Ernest Thomas Green was born in Moon Lake, Mississippi, to the late Mary Warford Green and Roosevelt Green in 1936. In his early years, the family moved to Memphis, Tennessee, where he accepted Christ and became a dedicated member of Summerfield Baptist Church. He graduated from Douglass High School (Memphis, TN) in 1954 and served honorably as a Human Resources Specialist in

the United States Army during the Vietnam War.
