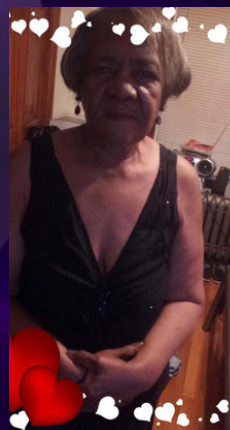
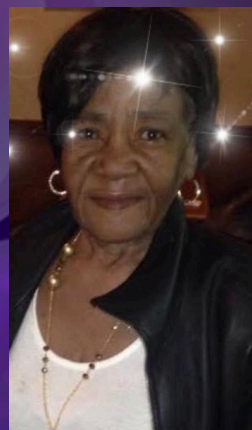
Life Reflections
