His story...

Christopher Jenkins Sr. was born on April 11, 1943, in Philadelphia, PA. When he was three, he was adopted by Stinton and Dora McDuffy in 1946.

He received his education in the Philadelphia public school system and graduated from Edison High School.

When Chris was around twenty, he left home to go stay with his grandmother, who needed his help. During this time, he met Myrna

Holmes, and they were married. From their union, they had three children:

Christopher Jr., Lisa, and Adriene Jenkins.

On March 2, 1965, he was inducted into the Army. He was stationed at Fort Devens Military Base, where he served in Vietnam. On February 19, 1966, he quickly advanced in rank, which then demonstrated his ability to serve, follow, and lead. On March 1, 1971, he completed his tour and was honorably discharged from the Army.

Christopher met Beverly, the love of his life, in 1980. In 1981, they were married, and God blessed them with love, friendship, and endurance. Their union was blessed for 40 years, until God called her home.

He worked all his life and retired from the City of Philadelphia. He enjoyed spending time with his wife, serving God, Taking Road trips, attending family cookouts, Fishing, listening to music, and spending time with family and friends, all while laughing and making others laugh. Bro. Chris was a master mason and was a member of the Paradise Lodge #1. During his time with the brotherhood on June 3, 2000, the City of Philadelphia awarded him a Citation acknowledging his contributions to Masonry, community and citizens of our city. In addition, he was awarded "Master Mason the year" for his dedicated perseverance, hardworking efforts and servant hood professionally and with the fraternity.

God had even bigger plans for Bro Chris life, On December 29, 2002, he answered the call he was Ordained by the late Reverend Bishop Thomas A Patrick as a Deacon at Greater Saint Luke Church.
