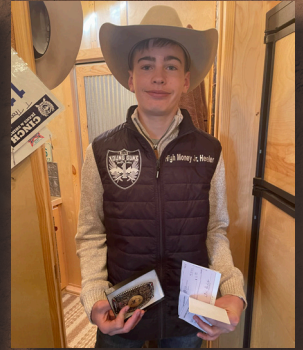

*Trigg Russell Thompson, 18, was born on  
May 25, 2007, and passed away on April 2, 2026,  
in Cheyenne, Wyoming.*

Trigg was born and raised between Cheyenne and Lusk, Wyoming, and spent much of his childhood at the Warren Ranch Company north of Cheyenne. As a small boy, he loved nothing more than splashing in the creek behind his mom's office, helping with the sheep and cows, and being part of every season—shearing, lambing, calving, branding. During the COVID break from school, he proudly worked full-time at the lambing camp, riding up each morning with the crew and staying all day. From the

start, he was a hard worker, dependable and eager to help. He also treasured traveling around the state with his dad, working cows and seeing ranch life in every corner of Wyoming.

Trigg's love for the outdoors shaped his life. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, and hiking, and his travels took him all the way to Africa. There, he not only hunted but visited a wildlife conservation reserve. Among his favorite memories were tagging a rhino and helping with the relocation of cheetahs—experiences that deepened his love for wildlife and the importance of protecting it. In 2024, he climbed Mount Kilimanjaro to over 19,000 feet, an accomplishment that spoke to his determination and spirit.

He attended Central High School in Cheyenne, where he was involved in wrestling, rodeo, and especially loved the Central High Welding program. He planned to attend Casper College in the fall and join the rodeo team.

Trigg was deeply loyal. If family or friends needed anything, they could always count on him. His smile was contagious, his hugs were unforgettable, and he had a way of making everyone feel seen and important.

He is survived by his parents, Ty and Roxanne Thompson; his brother, Tripp Thompson; and his sister, Cami (MJ, Ivey Taylor). He is also survived by grandparents Donna Thompson and Gary and Melody Garaventa; aunts and uncles Chad and Rosie Bliss, Sara Travnicek, Amanda and Jeff Cotton; and many cousins he dearly loved.

He is preceded in death by his uncle Barry Travnicek, aunt Rhonda Garaventa, and grandpa Cody Thompson.
