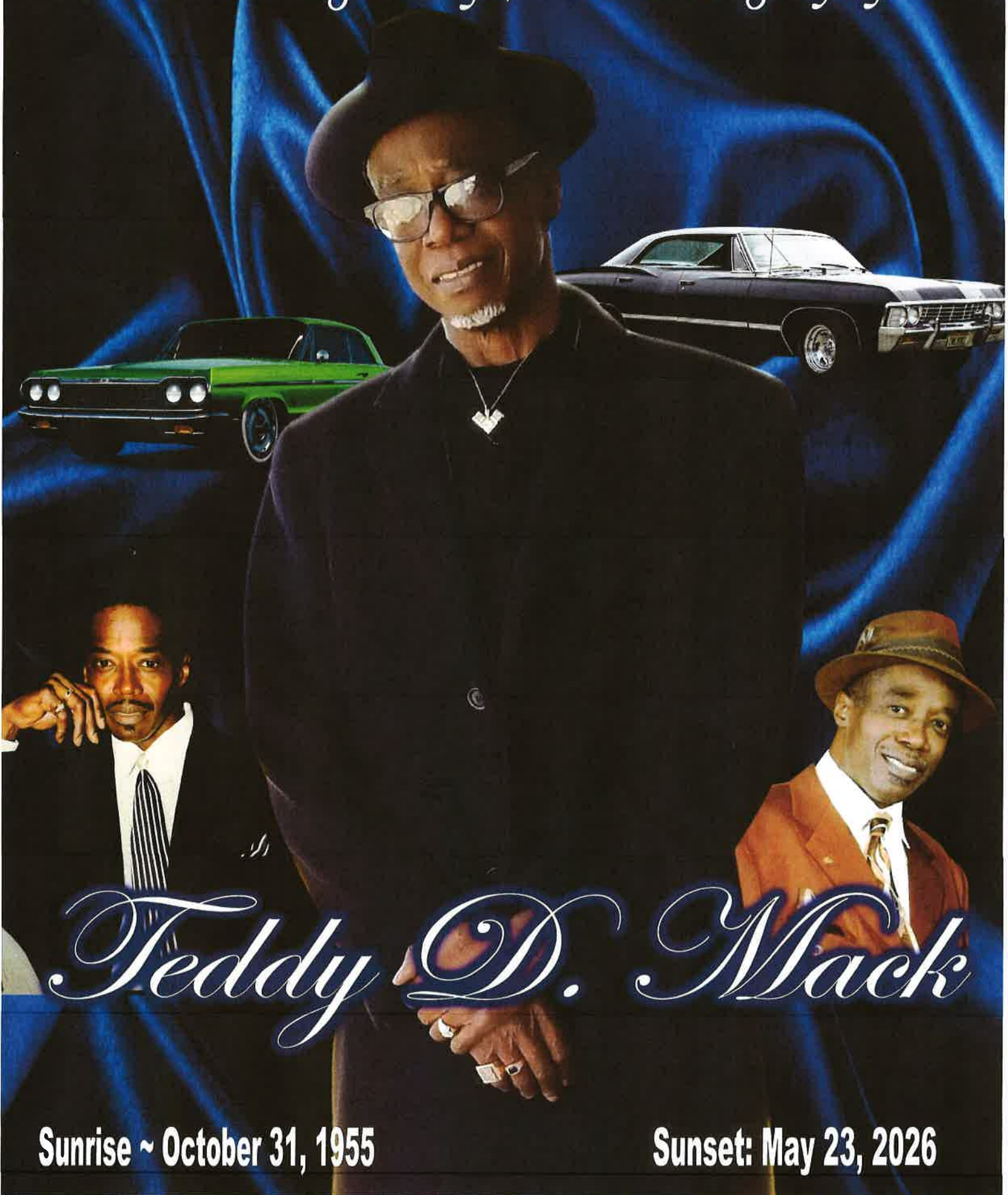

A step on the road to **HOME.**

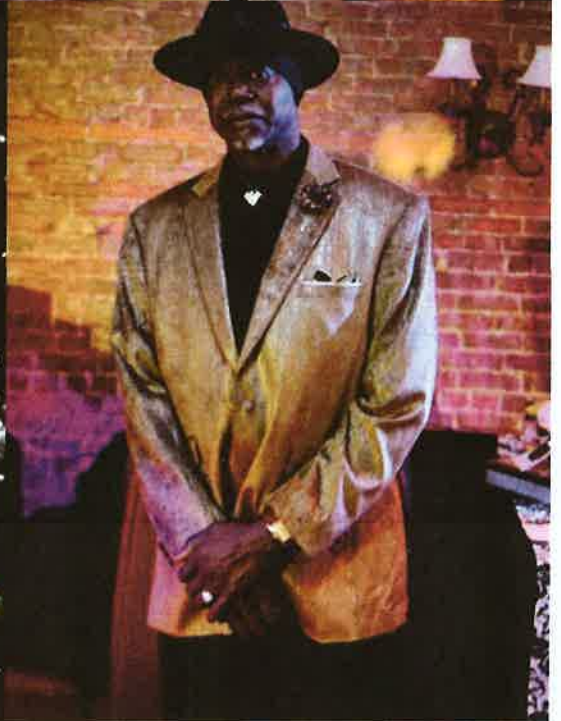
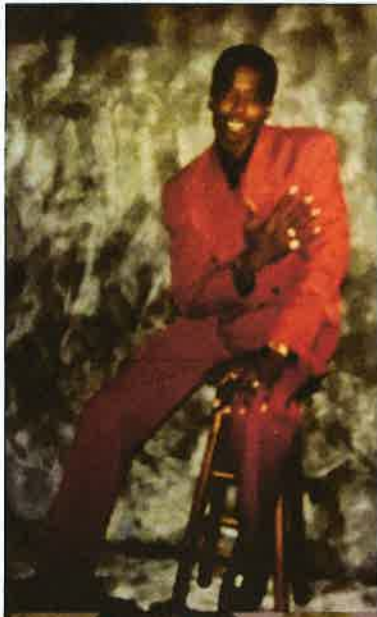

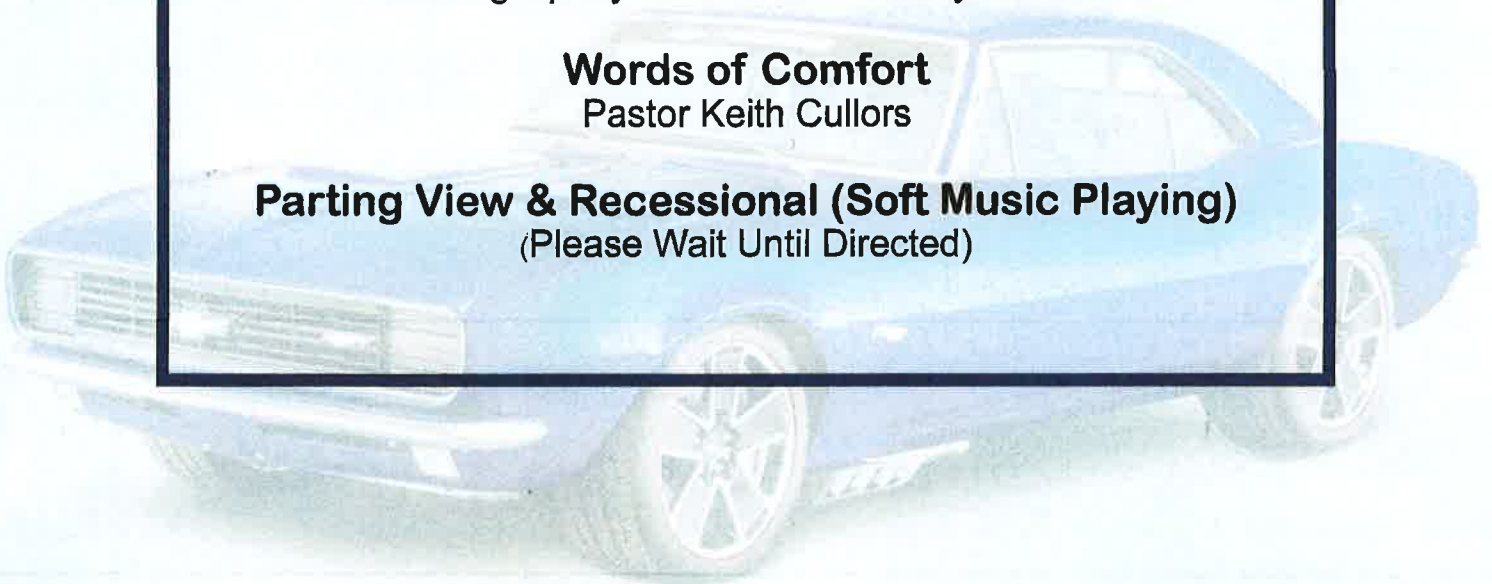
