Tony danced with his wife, Gwen, sharing moments of simple delight that reflected the deep bond they cherished. presence of mine enemies:**

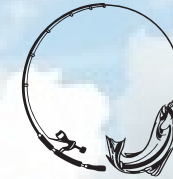
**Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup
