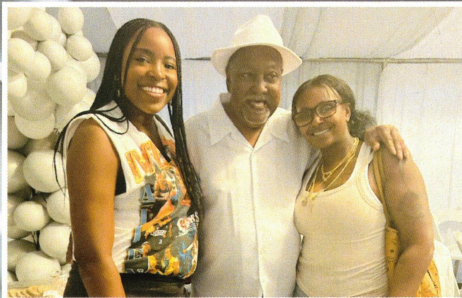
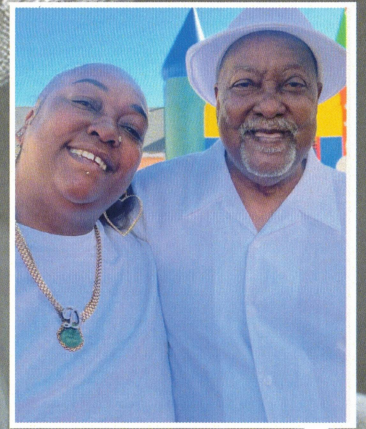
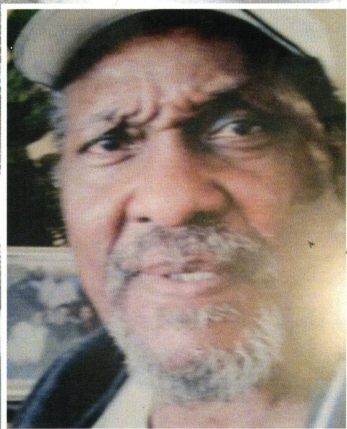
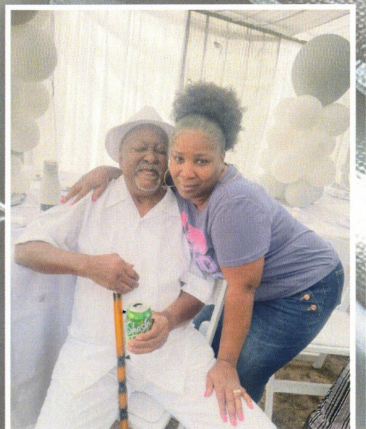
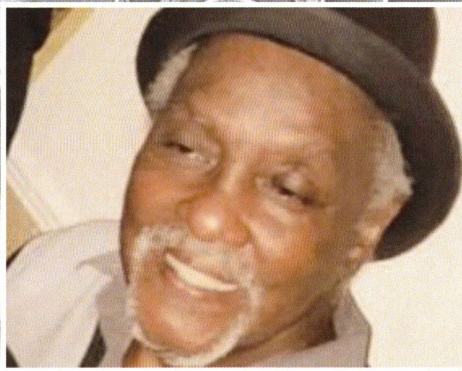
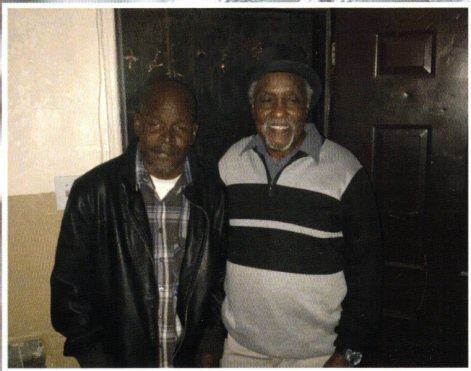
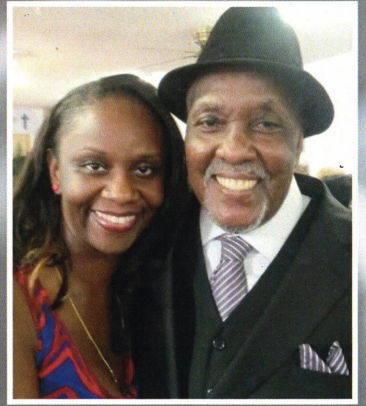
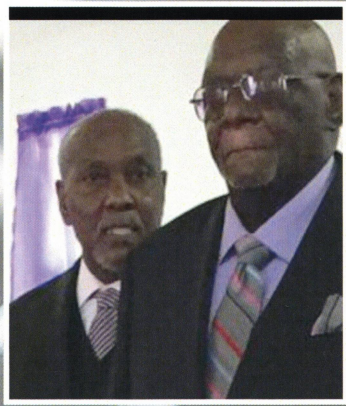
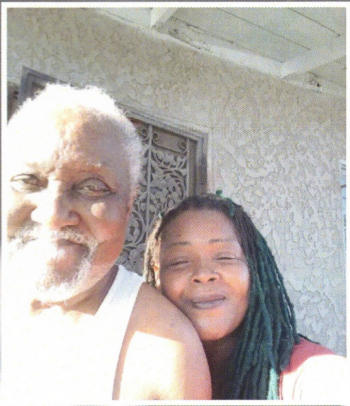
# BIOGRAPHY
